6.29.3	N.W.	First part light breeze and heavy weather foggy, clouds passing low.
"	"	Spent the Bark Arab sailing this season, and the Bark James Penner, two whales, bailing.
"	"	Saw whales bailed without success.
"	"	Middle part the same, lying aback.
"	"	Latter part light and pleasant still overcast, saw a rather sail to leeward, saw quite a number of whales lower fore boats starboard boat struck and saved. Discouraged water.

Hour	Day out Wind Course	Remarks on board Sunday June 22
6.29.3	N.W.	First part light breeze and overcast and pleasant employed in cutting.
"	"	Only of whales in sight.
"	"	Middle part clearing away the head breeze on, and setting in foggy.
"	"	Latter part very show, breeze and thick fog with misting rain, lying under short sail.

Hour	Day out Wind Course	Remarks on board Monday June 23
6.29.3	N.W.	First part light gales and wet heavy foggy, saw a few pinkbacks on opposite tack, water slightly discolored.
"	"	Middle part moderating, still foggy, at day light started the work.
