Sept 31 st	First part light air and still pleasant employe in cutting and clearing away, spook the Bark Arak nothing this season, land in sight
"	middle part the same started the work
"	Latter part still fine weather employe in boiling, saw a few fishbacks, and one whale, Esquimaux and the Kibinio in sight, in company with the Arak.
