First part light breeze and calm, with occasional squalls. saw several whales going quick to the S.E. the Deciduous in sight cutting water irregularly. Long by Chron. Alt. 164.46. Middle part moderate to fresh breeze and overcast. Latter part the same, saw a fine humpback, employed in cleaning her side.

Remarks on board Monday, Sept 17th

First part fresh breeze and overcast, with occasional squalls. at 6 A.M. blowing on the plain, check Deciduous in sight. Middle part calm off calm. Latter part calm and pleasant. employed in landing new mail S. post, and mending the old one, caught quite a number of cod fish. Left by Chron. 35.41

3rd 372 W

Remarks on board Tuesday, Sept 18th

First part at 4 P.M. took a light breeze from W. still fine weather, employed in mending sail, saw one sulphur bottom. Long by Chron. Alt. 165.44. Middle part the same saw a ship sailing hauled aboard and lashed until morning. Latter part light air and calm saw quite a number of whales. Larboard boat struck and cut the whale showed no sign to kill the Deciduous in sight sailing. Left by Chron. Alt. 3.2

Remarks on board Sunday, Oct 7th

First part breezes strong and flowing, with thick fog and light misting rain, shortened sail and luffed too heaving to the East. Middle part on opposite tack at 2 A.M. were still raining. Latter part fresh breeze and strong glass, by 7 A.M. S.E. by S. at 6 A.M. saw the Island of Cammuck about 20 miles distant bearing E. by S. 42 S. The Brigance in company. Left by marine Alt. 52.17

Remarks on board Monday, Oct 8th

First part strong breeze and overcast and a fine hail, at 2 P.M. lashed sail, within about 4 miles of the west side of Cammuck Island. Long by Chron. Alt. 52.17. Middle part at midnight veered to the S.W. and breeze quick to fresh gales. Latter part at daylight strong gales and broken clouds saw land small islands to the westward on Cammuck to the S.E. blowing hard in squalls steering to the southward through the narrow passage at 6 P.M. cleared the headland and entered the Pacific. Left by Chron. Alt. 52.17

Remarks on board Tuesday, Oct 9th

First part strong gales and heavy squalls of wind and sea, shaped our course for the Sandwich Islands. The Brigance in company, maintaining same. Long by Chron. Alt. 49.35. Middle part moderating, still squally. Latter part strong breeze and frequent squalls, with a heavy sea. variously employed, keeping standing sails and receiving rigging. The Brigance nearly out of sight astern. Left by marine Alt. 49.35
