Commenced With moderate winds and clear and pleasant weather & at daylight bore shore on the anchored anchor & at 10 AM bore up the anchor & put them on the lower

& so Ends these Twenty four hours

Remarks on Board Tuesday Dec 2

Commenced With pleasant weather at 5 1/2 PM the Captain came on board & then steered S.W. bore shore the middle & latter part as a bore the latter part saw a ship a heading to the westward no more & cloudy impleid in being boats

& so Ends these Twenty four hours

Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec 3

Commenced With thick and cloudy weather light breeze steering S.W. by the wind nothing in sight the middle part as a bore the last part mackerel and the ship bore up to S.E. bore shore nothing in sight nearly impleid about the ship

& so Ends these Twenty four hours
Lat = Long

Remarks on Board Thursday Dec 4

Commenced With light trade winds and passing clouds occasionally impleid a the ship nothing in sight middle part as a bore last part saw nothing & occasionally impleid a steering S.E. bore

Lat 18 32 N Long 158 15 W
& so Ends these Twenty four hours

Remarks on Board Friday Dec 5

Commenced With moderate trade winds and passing clouds occasionally impleid a bore the ship heading S.W. bore shore the middle as a bore the latter part strong winds heading as a bore nothing in sight & occasionally impleid as bore the ship

Lat 18 19 N Long = 158 00
