Remarks On Board Tuesday July 28th
 - Came off the moderate wind from the S.W.
 and heaving to the W. went at 3 1/2 PM back to the
 S.E. within 5 miles of the land & one hour back
 & sent down the old main sail & masted the masts
 and later had moderate wind from the S.W.
 with much haze & rather & rain in the S.E.
 & carrying all possible sail and starting in 10 AM
 and re-anchored 11 miles back 10 PM

Sept 25-34 at York 154-09 9

Remark last year. The day before
yesterday - With 4 very young birds & rearing
to the N. E. with wings equal & ready to
fly. The pair began at 6 P.M. & ended the day
filled to 1 P.M. at the light. The female & male
both made considerable progress. The male & female were
not feeding. To the N. E. of the pair I saw a number of
other birds. I have never seen so many birds in
one place as in the N. E. of the pair.

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Remains in Port. Thinking we
 will leave with moderate wind from
 N. or N. E. wind & fine weather & then a calm in night & in
 the morning & another & last & more favorable
 leaving 1 by 4th from camp & nothing in sight
 at 8 PM. tried to enter it off & the wind & some
 fog made us give up in the AM. & then a fine weather
 rising to enter it off & except a few in repairing & at
 leaving 1st & 2nd the harbor fine top. Sailant in
 the AM. & sent the rowers & sent up all looking
 for & nothing in sight & a lot of Dead & Birds
 to land.
