

Remarks On Board Ship E. Mayne.

Tuesday 18th May 1841

First part of these 24 hours employed sitting up, digging and various other jobs running down on the South side of Fagal under North all sail out sundown shortened sail to the N. E. W. Middle part cloudy latter part stood in for Fagal all sail out striking on Blackfish turned up 20 gallons packed as they standing in supposed to be the Roscoe of New Bedford.

Wednesday 19th May

First part of these 24 hours fine standing S. E. wind North land bearing S. E. at sundown shortened sail Middle part same latter part more ship in shore all sail out repairing Mainsail in forenoon. Slop for the last 24 hours weather to be.

Thursday 20th May

First part of these 24 hours fine steady S. by E for Fagal at sundown shortened sail off the bluff heading W. by S wind N. E. W. saw a number of boats at sundown none off shore to the W. S. W. and shortened sail Middle and latter parts strong winds under single reef winds N. W.

Friday 21st May

First of these 24 hours were ship to the S. W. E. under single reef saw Pinbacks at sundown shortened sail Fagal in sight bearing S. E. Middle part to heading off shore latter part tacked ship in shore saw plenty Pinbacks and a fair the afternoon.

Saturday 22nd May

First part of these 24 hours fine weather heading N. W. Fagal bearing S. E. by E distant 20 miles plenty Pinbacks wind N. by E Middle and latter part light air and calms 15 miles from the land.

Sunday 23rd May

First part of these 24 hours light air from the S. E. steering along the land to the North saw Pinbacks at sundown North point of Fagal N. W. E. by E for Fagal south part Fagal N. S. E. by E for Fagal and distant from the land 11 miles took in sail off shore to the S. W. at 9 O'clock plenty of Blackfish around Middle part calm latter part all sail out running down along the land west side of Fagal & Kings and a schooner in sight saw plenty of Pinbacks.

Off Western Islands

Monday 24th May

First part of these 24 hours steering in between Fagal & St George at 4 tacked ship off shore to the N. W. wind S. W. spoke Brig Cambrian of Boston 6 months out clean and the autumn of New York 2 months out clean Middle part same latter part all sail out off North end of St George saw 7 sails.

Tuesday 25th May

First part of these 24 hours fine weather wind N. E. W. heading North at sundown shortened sail Middle part heading the same at daylight more ship and made sail for in shore tacked in sight at 7 O'clock wind shifted to the N. W. heading to the W. S. W. and so worked around to the S. E. by E. began to the North.

W. A. S. Wednesday 26th May

First part of these 24 hours fine weather all sail out to the N. by W. at sundown shortened sail Middle part same latter part stood in shore with light winds Dreamed of being in the Taylor's Bay gave plenty of fish but none there that could be taken.

Thursday 27th May

First part light wind from the East heading in for Fagal all sail out at sundown shortened sail Fagal S. E. distant 25 miles more ship to the N. E. at 11 hours from the S. by E at daylight made all sail standing in for Fagal wind S. W.

Friday 28th May

First part of these 24 hours fine breeze from the S. S. W. all sail out at sundown shortened sail & Pinbacks off shore heading off Middle part strong winds more ship in shore at daylight stood in for the town on the S. E. side of Fagal went ashore at 12 came off with a few potatoes & onions made sail course S. E.

Saturday 29th May

First part of these 24 hours pleasant fair from the N. W. by W. course S. E. at sundown shortened sail 5 miles from Fagal on the N. E. side Middle part tacked ship in shore at daylight made all sail run off to the S. E. on the N. E. side and tacked to of shore 1 mile in light took in 2 or 3 miles of S. Sails heading to the N. by E wind N. W. at noon tacked in shore squally with rain the Am I want to see you to give you some fish come from Fagal.
