

Remarks On Board Ship *U.S. Wayne*  
Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> May 1841

First part of these 24 hours rain at 8 o'clock shaved off all sail out steering for the S. & part of Georgia at sundown shortened sail Middle parts fine weather latter parts same all sail out light air from E. & and calms the day after in light

Monday 31<sup>st</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours calms at Sundown shortened sail Georgia bearing N. E. distant 8 miles 1 Bk in sight Merchantman Middle parts laying South latter parts all sail out wind E by S. St. Michaels S. E. bearing at noon of beam tacked ship to the N. E. Hope and San Francisco River.

Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> day June 1841

First part of these 24 hours fine clear weather all sail out laying East wind S. E. by S. at sundown took in top Sails St. Michaels bearing S. E. distant 30 miles Middle and latter parts calm at 4 o'clock saw a Stern vessel distant 12 miles off supposed a small whale beyond the Boat and pulled up towards when he went down he came up about a mile and saw him turn Starboard and saw him 100 miles could not see him again bearing S. E. distant 25 miles no air steering

Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> day June

First part of these 24 hours no wind at 4 o'clock raised Blackfish's lowered struck to the waste Boat and drove twice struck to the Starboard Boat and from Broke so we got more Middle parts light air steered in for the land at daylight saw Blackfish's lowered and struck to Starboard Boat she got 2 waste Boat got 1 took then to the ship at noon got them all clear decks washed decks a plank over bottom in search of the steam ship President, land N. W. point bearing S. E. distant 15 miles saw whale

Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> June

First part of these 24 hours fine breeze from the S. E. at 1 o'clock raised 4 large whales about 20 miles from the point lowered and shortened Boat went on and missed their fair play went on again and Cooper struck him and stole the Boat and lost the line and lost him after pulling went on waste Boat and struck a large whale and he took the line and went off to the windward so we lost 2 line never got Boat store this day Middle parts tacked ship inshore latter parts employed repairing Boat and Boiling over Blackfish's laying off and on the Boat Mast 2 sail in sight

Off Western Islands

Friday 4<sup>th</sup> June 1841

First part of these 24 hours strong wind employed repairing Mast and clearing the decks turned up 5 Bk Mast part out at sundown shortened sail laying N. W. wind S. W. by E. found bearing E distant 8 miles Middle parts laying off shore at daylight tacked in set the Mainsail 2 sail in sight

Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> June

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from East under top Sails at Sundown tacked ship off shore west end the Island bearing N. E. W. the nearest part bearing South distant 8 miles Middle parts tacked inshore latter parts steered in to the Bay saw nothing store off

Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> June

First part of these 24 hours finished Larboard Boat and put her out at sundown shortened sail off shore 1 Bk in sight to leeward Middle parts off and on latter parts steered to S. E. up towards the east end all sail out have 15 miles off

Monday 7<sup>th</sup> June

First part of these 24 hours laying to the North wind N. E. by E. passed a Bk supposed a Portuguese Whal of War at sundown shortened sail west end Island bearing S. E. distant 30 miles Middle parts laying to the N. W. at daylight tacked ship off from Georgia latter parts laying off and on to the S. W. of the Island

Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> June

First part of these 24 hours fine weather wind N. E. by E. lowered for Blackfish got on to the Starboard Boat at sundown laying under top Sails wind N. E. W. land 15 miles off bearing N. W. and Middle parts laying between S. & E. in a calm latter parts light air steering N. for Georgia plenty fairies all around this afternoon stable below deck of Hope & Co

Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> June

First part of these 24 hours light winds employed in Boiling over Blackfish's steering for west end Georgia at sundown shortened sail Middle parts laying about N. of Georgia latter parts rainy 4 sail in sight at 10 o'clock strong winds from the North took in 5 & Mizen top Sails set sail laying off to the N. W. patch employed at various jobs fitted Spanish sheet Blackfish saw a Frigate
