

Ship Clifford Wayne from New Bedford

Wednesday 21st July 1841

First part of these 24 hours fine weather calm & by E light winds from N.W. Middle and latter parts flots of rain came up one hour down the other 23.

Thursday 22nd July Long 20° 00

First part of these 24 hours calm. Middle parts rainy wind all the way from E. to S. S.W. took in. High sails. Latter parts all sail out fine clear weather 3 ship in sight wind steady at S.W. and strong breeze

Friday 23rd July

First part of these 24 hours wind S.W. laying to the West all sail out Middle parts clear & breezy latter parts same no alterations in weather employed at various jobs and tacking ship from E. S.E. to West by South

Saturday 24th July

First part of these 24 hours wind S.W. all sail out laying to the West & sail in sight on the wind to the East and some to the West Middle parts same latter parts tacked ship to the E.S.E. all sail out

Sunday 25th July

First part of these 24 hours tacked ship to the W.S.W. all sail out wind S.W. strong 16k 1brig in sight Middle parts laying S.W. by W. latter the same all sail set strong winds and clear

Monday 26th July

First part of these 24 hours fine clear weather strong wind from South laying to the W.S.W. Middle parts same latter parts laying S.W. by W. strong winds employed at various rigging &c

Tuesday 27th July

First part of these 24 hours strong wind from South laying S.W. by W. all sail out 3 sail in sight Middle parts winds blathen light latter strong winds again employed in repairing Main Mast Gallant sail and so on

Wednesday 28th July

First part of these 24 hours strong wind from South laying S.W. by W. all sail out 3 sail in sight Middle parts winds blathen light latter strong winds again employed in repairing Main Mast Gallant sail and so on

To New Holland

Wednesday 28th July 1841

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the South all sail out on the wind to the S.W. watch employed on the Mission Rigger 1 ship in sight steering to the Port E. Middle parts wind S.E. by S latter parts S.E. & laying on the wind

Thursday 29th July

First part of these 24 hours wind light laying to the S.W. by S 1brig in sight Middle parts laying S.W. latter parts wind varying 24 points each way watch employed in tarring down and other duties

Friday 30th July

First part of these 24 hours wind rather light from the S.E. laying by the wind all sail out watch employed tarring &c. Middle and latter parts fine breeze laying to the S.W. watch employed about the rigging

Saturday 31st July

First part of these 24 hours fine breeze laying by the wind S.W. by W. all sail out 3 sail in sight Middle parts light air and equally latter parts all sail out to the S.W. strong breeze

Sunday 1st August 1841

First part of these 24 hours fine clear weather laying S.W. with a fine breeze from the S.E. by S. all sail out Middle parts fine clear weather full moon warm put me in mind of the girls latter parts no alterations

Monday 2nd August

First part of these 24 hours strong wind from S.E. by S. all sail out to the S.W. by W. 1brig in sight Middle parts strong winds and clear latter parts same took in both our anchors stowed them on the fore castle at 8.30 these 24 hours

Tuesday 3rd August

First part of these 24 hours no alterations in wind or weather Middle parts strong winds latter parts took in fore & main top 3 studding sails squally weather laying to the S.W. by S
