Wednesday 1st September 1841

First part of these 24 hours light air from S & hazy 6 at E pleasant weather as one wishes for Middle & latter parts same light air hazy 8 at S

Thursday 2^d September Long 19° 04' Lat 32° 49'

First part of these 24 hours fine clear with light air from from the S & hazy to the S & W middle parts wind hauled to the North course S & E latter parts same all sail set & pleasant

Lat 37° 17'

Friday 3^d September

First part of these 24 hours wind W course S & E all sail out at sundown wind W by N middle parts same latter parts wind hauled to the S & W

Lat 37° 55'

Saturday 4th September

First part of these 24 hours light winds from South hazy by the wind to the S & E all sail out middle parts light air latter parts same 6 at S

Sunday 5th Sept

First part of these 24 hours light wind from S & E all sail out course S & E and raining middle parts clear off fine latter parts strong winds course S & E

Long 30° 01' Lat 39° 29'

Monday 6th September

First part of these 24 hours strong S & W wind S & E by E all drawing sail set middle parts light winds at daylight began to freshen blow in on took in main sail

Long 33° 45' Lat 40° 00'

Tuesday 7th September

First part a gale from North course S & E took in fore & main & Gallant sails. Middle parts wind hauled to the S & W made all sail latter parts Moderate all sail out

Long 36° 00' Lat 38° 16'

Wednesday 8th September 1841

First part of these 24 hours fine weather all sail out wind W by N course S & E by E middle parts took in all Mast Stays sail strong Gale from the S & W latter parts same cloudy weather wind S & S by W latter parts

Long 39° 47' W Lat 35° 13'

Off Cape Good Hope For S Ocean

Thursday 5th September 1841

First part of these 24 hours cloudy wind light from the S & E with a heavy swell from the S & W steering by the wind middle parts going her own S & E wind at 6 took in main top Gallant sail and reefed main top sail

Lat 38° 44' South

Friday 10th September

First part of these 24 hours a Gale from S & E course S & E under close reef and fore sail at sundown took in fore & main top sail blowing on equally & raining with a heavy sea at 10 took in Starboard Boat of the crane and lay head she went clear left nothing but stern post at 12 midnight wind shifted to the S & W took in fore sail course S & E latter parts Moderate wind S by E

Lat 40° 00' this day

Saturday 11th September

First part of these 24 hours wind Moderate from S & E by S under single reef set main sail spanker & jib hazy to the E at sundown set down set down fore & main top Gallant yards middle parts took in main sail jib and Mast stay reefed the W sail hazy & N & E latter parts rainy weather and extra demand of Hoop about fore trusses and Mizen topmast

and S & H

Sunday 12th September

First part of these 24 hours thick and rainy under close reef middle parts rainy reefed the fore sail latter parts more moderate took the reef out set the main sail

Long by Chron 26° 27' Lat 37° 12'

Monday 13th September

First part of these 24 hours Moderate made all sail to the S & E wind South at 8 hauled a Whaler's fish from the ship and got him middle parts calm latter parts hoisted him out and appearing jib light wind from the S & W

Long 48° 00' W Lat 37° 09'

Tuesday 14th September

First part of these 24 hours fine wind from North course S & E all sail out middle wind hauled to the South light air latter parts calm and no wind appearing jib and Mizen in net and a new fore that checks

Long 50 Lat 37° 58'
