

Ship Clifford Wayne Off South

Saturday 22nd January 1842

Commences with strong Breezes from South under single reef at sundown Doubled Reef to the W & W Middle parts more Moderate latter parts all sail out

Long by the 10th 22nd E Lat 33rd 0th South



Sunday 23rd Jan

At five Breeze from the South and clear at sundown at 8th part 3 raised from Whales it is covered and struck a large Whale to the starboard Boat at 6 took him alongside and took in sail laying to the West Middle parts cloudy at daylight Commenced cutting at 12 finished the Mody

Long by the 10th 29th E Lat 22nd 57th S

Monday 24th January

First part took in the junk at 3 finished cutting and cleared up at 5 commenced Hoisting laying by the wind to the S W wind S by S Middle parts clear & cloudy under close reef with a strong wind Middle and latter parts same laying to the East employed in Hoisting

Lat 22nd 54th S

Tuesday 25th Jan

Strong winds laying to the East wind S & E Middle parts very rougher heavy sea Middle parts high sea latter parts heading to the S W at 12 Clock finished Hoisting with a gale from the S & E Long 106th 48th Lat 23rd 57th S

Wednesday 26th Jan

Full Moon Commences with a gale from the S & E laying to the S W & S under close Reef & Top Sails cleared up the decks and washed off Middle and latter parts a Gale from the S & E heading to the S. S. W Lat 23rd 20

Thursday 27th Jan

A light gale under close reefed Top Sails to the S W & cloudy Middle parts same saw a Blk returning to the W W at daylight commenced breaking out larboard side Main Hatch in forward for stowing down Lat 23rd 36th S

West Coast New Holland

Friday 25th January 1842

At A S Some weather rather a strong Breeze heading to the East wind S & E at sundown finished stowing down 76 bbls of Oil Middle parts cloudy latter parts fresh Breezes from the S named of S. A. S. sailing here at home with her gun block on some in with a high gill & some Lat 23rd 30

Saturday 26th Jan

Commences with strong wind from S & E under Top Sails and courses to the East Middle parts under double Reef latter strong wind took her ship to the S W Lat 23rd 15th S

Sunday 27th January

Commences with strong wind at A S H. Sailed reefed the Top Sails heading to the S W wind S & E at sundown took in fore sail jib & spanker Middle & latter parts a Gale from the S & E named of seeing George at home Lat 23rd 37

Monday 28th January

First part of these 24 hours a gale under S close reefed Top Sails at sundown took in fore sail latter parts set the same sail very rugged high winds Lat 24th 30th S

Tuesday 1st February 1842

Commences with strong winds under close reefed Reefs & fore sail unbent fore Top Gallant sail Middle parts weather same latter parts more Moderate under Double Reef jib and spanker more ship to the East Lat 24th 57th S

Wednesday 2nd Feb

Begins with fresh winds laying to the East employed at fitting hand pumps fitting Chocks in the mast and fitting whale gear and keel Middle parts same latter parts more Moderate under Double Reef & Main sail to the S W Lat 24th 50th South
