

Ship Clifford Wayne On

Thursday March 10<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with fresh wind from the S & E all sail out to the S & E at sundown shortened sail to the S & W Middle parts cloudy with a heavy swell latter part under single reef Long by the 108° 15' E Lat 28° 13' South

Friday March 11<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with fine weather since S & E laying to the S & W at sundown under double reef Middle parts cloudy latter part under top sail stowing down in main hatch Long by the 108° 15' E Lat 28° 13' South

Saturday March 12<sup>th</sup>

Strong winds from the S & E laying to the S & E at sundown shortened sail previous to taking in sail raised wheel going quick to the South lowered without success Middle parts took in sail to the S & W latter part made sail Long 109° 10' E Lat 28° 12' S

Sunday March 13<sup>th</sup>

Fresh winds all sail out to the S & E at sundown took in sail to the East Middle parts same weather latter part strong winds under single reef to the East wind S & E. Lat 29° 34'

Monday 14<sup>th</sup> March

Strong winds from the S & E and rugged laying East at 8 saw a Breach very rugged did not see him again at sundown wore ship to the S & W and took in sail latter part under Double Reef Lat 28°

Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> March

Strong winds and rugged as usual by the wind to the S & W at sundown took in sail to the South wind S & E Middle and latter fresh Gale under 3 Bowed Reefs Top Sails repairing Main Top Gallant sail Lat 28° 50'

Wednesday March 16<sup>th</sup>

Fresh Gale from the S & E steering S & W under Bowed Reef at sundown to the S & E Middle parts cloudy as usual at daylight made sail by the wind 1 sail in sight steering to the North Lat 28° 04' South

Thursday March 17<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day quite good weather employed repairing Main Top Sail, under Double Reef at sundown shortened sail to the South latter part smoky all sail out repairing Main Top Sail Long 108° E Lat 28° 18'

Friday March 18<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with fine breeze from the S & E all sail out to the S & W at sundown wore ship to the S & E and shortened sail Middle part fine latter part fine all sail out to the East wind S & E Long 108° 45' E Lat 28° 50' S

Saturday March 19<sup>th</sup>

Fine weather all sail out to the East at sundown shortened sail to the East Middle part fine latter part all sail out to the East fine weather and no whales Long by the 108° 45' E Lat 27° 14' S

Sunday March 20<sup>th</sup>

First part fine pleasant weather all sail out to the East wind South at sundown shortened sail Middle part fine latter part all sail out to the West & West the Night Long by the 109° 15' East Lat 27° 12' South

Monday March 21<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with fine weather and fine breezes all sail out to the S & W spoke Ship Two Brothers 4 Months out 50 lb sperm Capt Penkham no letters from Middle and latter part fine weather saw a Fin back
