

Ship Clifford Wayne Co

Thursday 28th 1842

Commenced with very fine smooth weather all sail out to the S E at sundown took in sail. Middle part fine latter smart Breeze did not make sail at daylight commenced stowing down 70 lbs Pil Long 118° 02 Lat 22° 28' Dredged off

Friday 29th April

Fine weather pleasant Breeze. From the S. S. E. strong off and breaking out darning to the East at sundown took in sail Middle part fine latter part breaking out the ground and repairing cables that is better

Saturday 30th April

Commenced with fine weather darning to the S W Middle and latter part repairing the ground the cables from fore deck 1 ship in sight

Sunday May 1st 1842

Fine part fine weather darning to the S W finished and got through with our cables and cleared the decks and washed off Middle part calm latter part light winds from S S W 6 ships in sight

Monday May 2nd

Commenced with fine pleasant weather winds light from the S S E strong S W all sail out at sundown took in S. S. Sails latter part fine weather all sail out to the East 2 sail in sight

Tuesday May 3rd

Fine weather light winds at sundown took in sail Middle part light winds latter part all sail out to the S S W 4 ships in sight 18 Long by clock 110° 04 E Lat 23° 27

West Coast New Holland

Wednesday 4th May

Commenced with strong winds from S E all sail out to the S S W at sundown took in ship to the East and horizontal sail Middle part strong winds latter under top Sails to the S E 2 Long by clock 111° 33 E Lat 23° 04 S

Thursday 5th May

Commenced with strong wind and rough under top Sails to the East at sundown took in sail Middle part Moderate daylight taken ship to the S W and made sail Lat 23° 35 S

Friday 6th May

Fine part of this day fresh winds from S E under top sails 15 courses to the S W quite smoky at sundown took in 15 courses under top sails latter part fine weather all sail out to the West Long 110° 20 E Lat 23° 39 S

Saturday 7th May

Fine weather all sail out to the West and no whale at sundown took in sail Middle part rugged latter same under Double Reef top Sails to the S W 6 ships in sight Lat 24° 15 South

Sunday 8th May

Strong winds and Rugged under Double Reef to the S E under 18° S at sundown took in 15 courses under top sails and more ship to the S E Middle and latter part a light Gale from S E under 15 courses and 15 courses under top Sails Lat 23° 50 S

Monday 9th May Long 109° 13

Fine part quite moderate heading to the S E Middle part Moderate latter part calm Long 109° 36 E Lat 23° 00 S

Tuesday 10th May

Calm at sundown took in sail light air from the S W Middle part calm latter part Same same (Blackbird)
