light airs laying to the East at sundown
took in sail (Maiden parts fine light airs latter part
all sail out to the S W 2 ship in sight saw (Sibbalds)

Thursday 12th May

First part fine all sail out
to the S W at sundown spoke ship Hurst off Co. of B. & J. & Co.
had got nothing since spoken last & Barclay Briggs of B. & J. & Co.
24 months out 1700-1800 from latter part fine all sail out S W

Long 109° 51' E Lat 23° 20' S

Friday 13th May

First weather all sail out
to the S W saw 2 ships at sundown took in sail latter part strong
winds came West at noon spoke ship Stephana of B. & J. & Co. 5 months
out 1800 from latter part fine all sail out S W

Lat 23° 59' S

Saturday 14th May

First part of this day strong winds
laying by the wind to the S W at sundown took in sail Maiden
parts fine latter part calm

Lat 24° 41' S

Sunday 15th May

Commenced with light airs from
East to N E by the wind to the S E Maiden parts (Barrel)
latter equally with rain and wind from the West double day

Monday 16th May

Commenced with fine weather
wind most laying to the N E at 11 under Puffs fine pleasant light
winds Maiden parts wind S W air, squally latter part under
short sail to the E & S E covered cloudy weather with a
strong breeze and mazy sea

Lat 24° 24'

West Coast New Holland

Tuesday 17th May 1842

Commenced with strong winds

from S E & under short sail to the East at sundown More (Moderate)
quite pleasant weather Maiden & latter part strong breeze squally
weather 1 ship in sight

Lat 23° 11' S

Wednesday 18th May

Commenced with squally weather at sundown

took in sail to the N E more pleasant weather Maiden latter part under
long Puffs

Lat 22° 55'

Thursday 19th May

First part of this day fine repairs
took sail heading to the S W 1 ship in sight Maiden latter part fine
latter part 4 ship in sight

Lat 22° 40'

Friday 20th May

First weather all sail out
to the North at sundown spoke ship John & Edwards of B. & J. & Co. Capt
Hudson 12 months 2000 from latter part fine all sail out S W
first fine latter part the Carter Jacket 2 ships off did not speak

Lat 22° 50' S

Saturday 21st May

First part of this day fine
spoke ship Sullivan of B. & J. & Co. Capt Mayhew 5 months nothing
got a letter from David Maiden parts fine at day light Maiden
all sail from S W at 9 a.m. raised anchor however and
steered to the West Coast of New Holland (Starboard Boat)

Long 109° 40' E Lat 22° 12' South

Sunday 22nd May

First weather took our whaler
longside and commenced cutting at sundown lashed a crown & spoke
the Lexington of Providence Capt James 5 1/2 months out clear
Maiden strong winds till daylight commenced cutting at 11 finished
the Rodys and got ready for the heads & other ship cutting

Long 109° 40' E Lat 22° 15'
