

# Ship Clifford Wayne On The

Monday 25<sup>th</sup> May 1842

First part of these 24 hours very good weather at 5 finished hauling the Cases and got all clean Commenced Boiling at sundown At the 10<sup>th</sup> Cardeanour at Bedford Cott Weeks 11. 11. 5-10<sup>th</sup> Spence for which got 2 letters from H & S Middle parts Boiling latter parts Boiling under short sail to the North wind E or E

Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> May 1842

Strong winds and suggested sailing to the North under short sail Boiling. Middle more ship to the S. E. wind E or E. latter parts finished the Body Lat 22° 00'

Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> May

Strong winds under short sail to the E S E & S E Boiling. Middle parts equally & rainy, cooled down latter parts finished Boiling plenty of rain cleared the decks and washed off

Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> May

Commenced with plenty of rain at daylight cleared off, calm, 1 sail in sight Middle & latter parts fine weather sailing to the W S W Long 110° 00' E. Lat 22° 29'

Friday 29<sup>th</sup> May

Very pleasant weather sailing to the S W by W 2 sail in sight Middle part fine latter parts good weather at daylight commenced stowing down Larboard side Case Hatch away saw 2 ships chasing whales at 10 lowered for whales in company with 2 ships. Boats without success. Middle part

Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> May

Clear weather 6 ships in sight chasing whales all around us at 3 lowered for whales and struck to the starboard Boat at 5 took him alongside saw 1 other ship take a whale spoke Mt Canton Jacket 11<sup>th</sup> Capt H. Shannan 6 months out, no letters Long 110° 03' E Lat 23° 16'

and commenced stowing down stowage 75<sup>th</sup> finished at 9 P M Middle part at daylight commenced cutting at 11 finished Body at 12 took in junk & sail in sight 110° 03' E Lat 23° 16'

Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> May

First part of this day rather the and started the works work ship to the East under E or E. Middle latter parts pleasant 2 ships in sight Lat

Monday 30<sup>th</sup> May

First part of this day calm Boiling Middle parts light breeze from S. S. E. heading to the S W Middle parts fine latter parts equally wind from S W Long 110° 33' Lat 23° 05' S

Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> May

Commenced with strong winds from S S W. with plenty of rain 2 ships in sight at sundown finished Boiling and took in sail At the East under S S E Middle part cloudy latter parts fine all sail out to the S W, ship in sight Lat at 10

Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> April

Commenced with strong rainy weather Middle part overcast latter parts cloudy commenced stowing down Case Hatch 2 ships in sight dreamed of H. A. rather long and Long about 111° 14' S or S

Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> April

Commenced with strong winds employed in stowing down spoke ship Columbus Fatharin 2<sup>nd</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> out 1600 At 10 till Capt H. saw a ship to wind take a whale Middle part cloudy latter parts fine stowing down 200 At 11 and washed off Deck 2<sup>nd</sup> No 2
