Friday 3 April 1842

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under top sails to the east passed a ship, putting, 1 other in sig. 15
Anchored, went took in sail to the S W. latter made sail
coast 20 by 25

Saturday 4th April

West Part cloudy weather
course at 21° at sundown took in sail to the North Windward
part squally latter part thick rainy weather took in sail in corner
East haying to the West & a ship in sight etc etc

Sunday 5 April

Strong winds from the East
and a plenty of rain under rapid Main top Sail. Over rain
for the last 10 days past that I have seen for months. Much
light rain more this than E. S. E. rather fast smoky made all
sail to the East. Strong winds from E. S. E.

Long 111° 04' E. Lat 23° 36' S.

Monday 6th April

Some times with strong winds
from S.W. & all sail out by the river to the East. Another part
under the Fair Hope Ship & many Montserrat & the 200 lb Capt. Ship
rather part fine count & S.W. wind blows.

Long 11812 Shore gives us 22 miles from land Lat 23° 32' S

Tuesday 7th June

since cables sagging to the E. at 8 at sunset top of Mast sails
 up in latter part all sail out to the E. at 8 wind S. E. & fresh breeze
 top sails hand not in sight *remains at the Lat 22° 45'*

S. & all sail out at 1 o'clock, whaler at 2 o'clock for them and struck
 to the Starboard B. and took him to the ship, the rest took off in shore
 2 ship in sight Midship back fine cotton back cut him in and commenced
 Working stood in shore, land, point Bluffs bearing E by S
 Long by shore about 65 Miles to far west Lat 22° 34' N

Thursday 8th June

Commodore with fine weather variable wind
tacked off shore spoke ship Marcia Fairhaven Capt Mosher 5 month out
with no letters & Stephania no oil since spoken last midday laying off shore
midday parted light wind tacked ship in shore at daylight could down
tacked ship off shore to the Westward ex-ct 20 m the other ship in company
Left 22:54 South

Friday 10th June

Commences with fine breeze
from the north landing to the west all sail out land out of sight
middle part tack'd ship to the E & at daylight land in sight of the
Bk. Sophia & Elizabeth of - - - - - Durham Coast & Coffin is Mont-
at 600th from latter part larger to the north

Saturday 15th June

Commenced with squalls
 rather wind from the South course N by E. ^{light} backing & by S
 about 18 miles at sundown spoke with Elizabeth & Bretchen
 Capt Winslow 9 months out with from Middle-part five courses
 N by E & E. better same course N by E
 Lat 20° 09' S

Sunday 12th June

Fine weather all sail out to the
 E. N. E. wind S. E. by S. Weather quite light air latter part same
 no Blackbird Lat^h 19° 23' S

Monday 13th June

First part calm M. sea part same
better part light wind from S. S. some S. W. & saw plenty Blackfish
Lat 18° 50'

Tuesday 24th June

Commenced with fine breeze from
S E all sail out to the CR & made a pleasing drive but the
sea pinbacks brought us rather far to fine breezes from E of CR
laying to the North
Long $116^{\circ} 31' E$ Lat. $18^{\circ} 30' S$
