

Ship Clifford Wayne On A

Sunday 31st July 1842

First part of this day thick rainy weather. Doubled Reefed the Top Sails and wore ship to the S. E. saw a ship steering West all sail out Middle part same latter part More Moderate set Main sail & Jib
Long 111° 33 East Lat 14° 20

Monday 1st August 1842

This afternoon More Moderate looked sharp for Whales but could see none Middle part Overcast latter fine all sail out to the S. E.
Lat 13° 46 S

Tuesday 2^d August

Commenced with fine weather good Breeze from S. E. haying S. E. and steering North Middle by the wind latter part squally with rain course West
No Ob.

Wednesday 3^d August

Began with rainy squally weather closed Reefed the Top Sails haying S. W took in Fore Sail at sundown Middle part a Gale latter same with a heavy sea

Thursday 4th August

Regular as the last day indeed a Gale with a heavy sea haying S. by W took up the Mast and wore ship to the S. E. blowing hard in squalls latter part same
Long Lat 13° 56 South

Friday 5th August

First part under closed Reef Top Sails to the S. E. Middle part same latter part same weather More Moderate set the Fore Sail haying S. E. & S. W. E Long 110° 00 Lat 12° 56 South

Cruise off Shore

Saturday 6th August 1842

First part of this day Moderating fast sundown got to be good weather Middle part fine latter under Top Sails Jib & Jibboom to the S. E. by E Long 111° 21 E Lat 12° 12 South

Sunday 7th August

First part of this day fine weather haying to the S. E. by E. caught a blunt cross Breeze at sundown set her under Doubled Reefed Top Sails courses up Middle and latter quite good weather saw nothing
Lat 11° 26 S

Monday 8th August

Fine weather More Moderate under Doubled Reefs to the S. W saw a ship steering W. S. 40 Middle part took in sail latter part under Doubled Reefs to the S. E. & S. E. haying
Long 110° 55 E Lat 11° 58

Tuesday 9th August

First part regular employed in turning moving Mallets Middle part took in sail to the S. 40 latter More Moderate haying S. W by S Long 111° 13 E Lat 11° 36 S

Wednesday 10th August

First part of this day strong Breeze at sundown took in Fore & Mizzen Top Sails to the S. W Middle & latter part same
Long 110° 22 E Lat 12° 14 S

Thursday 11th August

Commenced with very good weather employed about the rigging Middle part same latter part very good weather to what has been haying up S. by E winds S. by South
Long 110° 02 East Lat 13° 46 South
