Sunday 18th September

Commenced fine day by the wind to the SE at sundown tacked to the NE Middle & latter parts fine weather and no fish Long 107° 41 Lat 12° 37 S

Monday 19th September

Commenced fine all sail set by the wind to the South at sundown took in light sails Middle & latter parts fine by the wind to the SE all sail out Long 107° 41 Lat 12° 37 S

Tuesday 20th September

Commenced fine all sail set by the wind to the SE all sail out by the wind to the SE wind SE & E Long 107° 19 E Lat 14° 34 South

Wednesday 21st September

Commenced fine light wind from the SE by the wind to the SE Middle & latter parts calm Long 107° 56 E Lat 15° 05

Thursday 22nd Sept

Commenced calm Middle & latter parts light wind from the South latter parts same all sail out to the East Long 108° 48 E Lat 15° 10

Friday 23rd

Commenced with fine breeze from the SSE all sail out to the East at sundown took in sail Middle parts squally & rainy latter under strong wind (Wednesday 21st Sept 1842) commenced at a house some where near the shore went into the store she came out of bed and dressed had a squaw in the same room to bed on in the same bed thought she was smart and a good smith on and had given much younger than when I last seen her

Saturday 24th September

Commenced with strong wind under double Rigs by the SE wind SE by S at sundown took in sail Middle & latter parts fine weather and no fish Long 111° 40 East Lat 13° 38 S

Sunday 25th September

Commenced very good weather by the wind to the SE by E under SE & E Middle & latter parts fresh breezes by the wind to the SE Long 111° 12 E Lat 14° 15

Monday 26th Sept

Commenced with fine breeze spoke ship Averick at 13 26 months out 17 to the Sperm Middle parts in sail latter all sail out to the SE Long 111° 35 S

Tuesday 27th September

Commenced with strong wind at sundown took in sail latter parts same Long 110° 40 East Lat 15° 00

Wednesday 28th Sept

Commenced with strong wind tacked to the East SE East more moderate Middle & latter parts wind under double Rigs Long 109° 30 Lat 14° 25

Thursday 29th September

Commenced with strong wind well to the South by the wind to the East at sundown took in Rigs & Rigs top sails Middle parts heavy squall latter under short sail to the East Long 111° 03 Lat 14° 12 S

Friday 30th September 1842

Commenced more moderate by the wind to the East and sandy Middle & latter parts same Long 111° 55 East Lat 13° 41 S
