Tuesday 20th December

Commences almost calm employed about at various parts Middle & latter part calm

Long 117° 34' East Lat 36° 23'

Wednesday 21st December

Commences fine weather good Breeze from E S E varying by the wind South all sail out Middle and latter parts being S S W fine pleasant weather but rather cold

Small Dick

Lat 37° 41' South

Thursday 22nd December

Commences with light winds from S E all sail out to the S S W repaired some sail & by 10 AM Middle & latter parts light easterly winds all sail out to the S S E

W. O. O.

Lat About 38° 55'

Friday 23rd December

Commences with light winds from E by N, on the S E eastern tack at sundown saw whales suppose to be right whale Middle calm latter light breeze from the East by the wind to the S S E and logging at 11 saw 2 right Whales however and struck to the Lashoance 13

W. O. O.

Saturday 24th December

Took our whale alongside and commenced cutting took the flukes nearly 1000 in. let the rest go and got my hand jammed Nasty fine pleasant weather bright in looking Long 110° 05' East Lat 40° 30' South

Sunday 25th December

Very pleasant weather Boiling wind of E V Course. S S E strong sails out saw plenty right whales and first rate weathered whels at home and heaving along to the S S W Middle fine latter very fine Course E S E plenty Whales and at Home moving slow to the N E

Long 112° 36' East

Lat 40° 47' N

Ship The Pacific Ocean

Monday 26th December

Commences fine pleasant weather all sail out Course E S E wind N W and some whales in sight

Middle fine strong breeze latter employed in stowing down Course E S E

Long 115° 43' East Lat 41° 18'

Tuesday 27th December

Commences strong wind all sail out Course E S E stowed down after 4 PM Whales Cal and put 2 casks in main Hatch May in all about 5 PM Middle & latter parts Course E S E winds West to N W

Long by Chron 119° 19' East

Lat 41° 44' South

Wednesday 28th December

Commences more moderate all sail set Course E S E winds W N W Middle & latter fine weather all sail out wind N W and N N E employed in stowing down

Long 122° 14' East

Lat 42° 00'

Thursday 29th Dec

Commenced of seeing right whale and being all the other ship with that it was not going to get married and was not many in and she crying the right whale but it was out of her sight and she not commencing with light winds from N N E course E S E all sail out saw right Whales Middle both took in stowing sails wind N N E latter part strong breeze on the wind E by S

Long 124° 45' East

Lat 42° 44'

Friday 30th December

Commences with strong winds from N N E by N all sail out by the wind and fine over head Middle & latter rainy Double reefed the top sails with strong Breezes

Long 126° 55' East

Lat 43° 45'

Saturday 31st December 1842

Commences more moderate sat the top sails hoisted off with the wind N N W made all sail Course East with fine Breezes at 9 PM passed a ship Boiling Middle parts both squalls latter parts took in stowing sails some merrin top sails wind varying from N W to N E by E

Long 130° 51' East

Lat 43° 51'
