

Ship Clifford Wayne

Sunday March 26th 1843

First part of this day fine wind East all sail out by the wind at 6 at sundown took in top of sails course at 6 Middle part same latter part fine all sail out at 8
Long by 145° 46' 20" Lat 3° 30' S

Monday March 27th 1843

First part of this day fine all sail out with a fine breeze and nothing to be seen Middle of the day at 6 latter part off at 6 all sail out good breeze
Lat 4° 05' South

Tuesday March 28th

First part of this day strong wind from at 6 all sail out by the wind Middle and latter part strong wind from at 6
Long 145° 50' Lat 12° 36' S

Wednesday March 29th

Commenced with strong winds from at 6 by the wind employed in starting Mace in the shark casks Middle and latter part wind at 6 by the wind at 6
Long 145° 33' West Lat 1° 40' South

Thursday March 30th

Commenced fine wind at 6 all sail out at 6 Middle part at 6 by 6 latter part fine breeze from East
Long 145° 25' West Lat 0° 50' Miles South



Friday March 31st

First part of this day fine from East all sail out at 6 saw a Finback Middle part took in top of sails at 6 Main sail latter strong breeze from at 6 all sail out
Long 145° 28' West Lat 10° 10' Miles North

Saturday April 1st 1843

First part of these 24 hours good breeze from at 6 all sail out to the North at Sundown took in top of sails Middle fine latter all sail out No Long
Lat 00 30 Miles South

On The Line

Sunday April 2^d 1843

Commenced fine all sail out to the S & E at sundown took in light sails Middle and latter part squally with fresh breezes by the wind at 6 by 8
Long 146° 20' West Lat 2° 10' S

Monday April 3^d

First part of this day strong winds from at 6 by 8 by the wind to the S at Sundown took in top of sails Middle and latter part strong winds and squally latter part to the at 6
Lat 3° 00' S

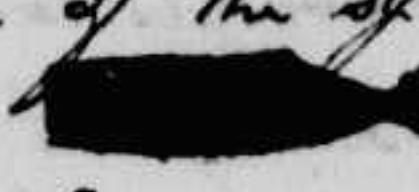
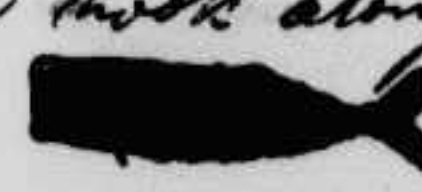
Tuesday April 4th

First part of this day fresh winds from East by the wind to the North all sail out Middle part took in light sails latter all sail out by the wind at 6 by 8
Long 146° 33' West Lat 1° 45'

Wednesday April 5th

Commenced as usual Middle part same latter part fine weather by the wind at 6 by 8 at 2
Lat 11.50 Miles S

Thursday April 6th

First part of this day fine all sail out after the Mace saw them after at 3 saw them shoot a shoal of Sperm Whales however and struck to the S & E and the Blue of the Finback whales going quick went on through to the West Boat after breaking 1,000 or 1,200; and chasing until sundown and then struck to the S West and Finback but the pick up a dead whale at dark took over whale alongside and took in sail Middle last got ready for setting at daylight commenced cutting at noon got all clear and marked off took the heads in by putting a hook alongside of the spout hole
