

Ship Clifford Wayne For

Wednesday April 19th 1843

Commenced with strong trades and overcast but no rain by the wind at 20 with M & S sail out. Middle part same latter part took in main top sail and unhooked S & S sail and repaired it Long 150°40 West Lat 10°40 North

Thursday April 20th 1843

Commenced with strong wind from the N & E under top sails & courses by the wind bent the S & S sail down over head Middle and latter strong trades by the wind at 20. Partly repaired main top sail Long 151°35 West Lat 12°20 North

Friday April 21st

Commenced with strong trades as usual under top sails and courses by the wind at 20 & saw black fish Middle part steering at latter same with strong trade made new main black cloth Long 152°15 West Lat 13°56

Saturday April 22^d

First part of this day strong trades as usual Middle part single reefed latter same course at Long 152°40 W Lat 15°30 N

Sunday April 23^d

Commenced more moderate breeze at 4 o'clock course at 20 W Middle part same latter part fine Long 153°51 Lat 18°10 N

Monday April 24th

First part of this 24 hours fine weather calm at 20 at 2 o'clock shortened sail Middle part at 3 saw the volcano on the mountain bearing at 20 by 10 latter made sail at daylight steered for the South point at noon the South point bore W by S distant 8 miles at noon sun Long 155°31 W Lat 18°58

Tuesday April 25th

First part fine going down along shore at sundown took in said South point bearing East Middle part strong breeze at 12 backed in shore latter part running down along shore fine weather canoes off Lat 19°11 N

Sandwich Islands

Wednesday 26th

Commenced with fine weather and light winds Middle part fine light winds from the N & E took ashore other parts steering in for Karakakua Bay took a pilot & sail in sight

Thursday 27th

Commenced with very light air from N & W at 4 o'clock came too in 13 f and put the fish Middle part latter employed in wooding and getting potatoes with the rest of the time got our accounts

Friday 28th

First part fine got ready for sea Middle part same at 4 o'clock took an anchor and stood out latter part light air steered our anchor

Saturday 29th

Commenced fine at 3 o'clock raised anchors lowered and struck to L B. W. B. 1. & B. 1. 2 of them being dead at 11 o'clock took them alongside the Bay distant 12 miles at daylight summer sea cutting at noon finished with light winds current taking us to the South

Sunday 30th

Commenced fine employed at clearing away heads &c Middle part same latter part got 8 men employed in building and other jobs the May in sight the bunch too

Monday 1st May

First part of this day fine weather working all sail out by the wind along shore at the 12 o'clock Middle part stood over towards where took at 8 o'clock strong doubled reefed latter rigged took in fore & main top sails heading at 20 W
