Monday August 7th

Commenced fine fine breeze from
S & by S. Weather & sea were middle and rather poor
fine weather all sail out to the S & East

 took in Port Biddle fine latter all sail out to the East saw Mouchie

from S.W. & back all sail out 5 P.M. in sight spoke ship. Dungen
left Hagersty at anchor at 3¹/₂ P.M. out 1300 lbs. powder and rather

Saturday 12th Aug 1884

Barometer as usual at Pendown spoke
At Lexington of Providence at same 20. Inches 450 ft
Middle part could keepd better strong winds from N.E
by the wind to the West

from S E by the wind East under Double Reef at Sundown close
