Sunday Oct 8th 1843

Commenced fine wind S S W
course S S E under top sail, jib & Gaff. Middle parts same
latter made all sail wind S W and West & Ship in sight steering to the
East
Long 157° 35' West Lat 29° 38'

Monday Oct 9th

First part of these 24 hours strong wind
from the North and squally, took in 3/4 Mizzen top Sails Boatswain S S E
at sundown same reefed in Main top sail took in the top Sails and
fore sail and set the spencers blowing fresh wind S S E and latter
part repaired Main top sail and set them doubled reefed
Long 156° 15' West Lat 28° 20' N

Tuesday Oct 10th

First part of these 24 hours
rugged with strong winds from the North. Course S S E under 2 reefed top
sails and fore sail. Middle parts no alteration latter parts Moderate
all sail out employed at various jobs

Long 155° 35' W

Lat 27° 30'

Wednesday Oct 11th

First part of these 24 hours fine
middle and latter parts same all sail out winds fresh from S W
Course S E and S S E

Long 154° 50' West

Lat 26° 00'

Thursday Oct 12th

First part of these 24 hours fine
fresh wind from S W Course S S E all sail out finished stowing
down and other small jobs Middle parts no alterations latter parts under new
Course S S E
Long 154° 40' West Lat 24° 33' N

Friday Oct 13th

First part of these 24 hours fine
weather all sail out Course S S E winds North Middle parts under
fine repairing Main top sail & Course S S E
Long 154° 52' Lat 23° 24' N

Sandwich Islands. 1843

Saturday Oct 14th 1843

First part of these 24 hours fine weather
lost sight from S W repaired Main top sail and bent it and Main
top sail Course S S E by E Middle and latter parts no alteration
Long 154° 50' Lat 22° 00' N

Sunday Oct 15th

Commenced as usual Course South
middle - very light air from S W West Course S S W at daylight light wind
from the S W Course S S W Only in sight and East end of Moore
bearing S W with plenty of squalls along the land
Long 155° 47' West with East end Moore bearing S S W and West end Lat 21° 07' N
& sail bound in

Monday Oct 16th

First part of these 24 hours strong wind from S E
first traders we have had at 4 Moore East end bearing S S E distant 15 miles
the course S S E at 9 P M. took in 1/2 Sails and laid aback at 4 P M
Course S S E for the passage with a strong breeze from S E at 10 came
to anchor at Moore 32 sail of vessels at anchor or in. then 24 hours
left given ashore for recruits got potatoes and yams and a little of
every thing that the Island produces and 2 bags of Mutton or 60 lbs

Thursday 26th Oct 1843

First part of this day fine I am on shore
at sundown came on board Middle parts getting at daylight got under
weigh took the anchor and fired 4 guns and stood out for next passage
with a strong breeze the the South point of Moore bearing S S E and
of the Long 157° 16' West with the 2nd Lat

Friday 27th Oct

First part strong winds buffed the around
Moore only the wind to the North wind S S E Middle parts under
S S E latter parts all sail out 1 ship hauled in another bound out
