

Ship Clifford Wayne E. Crowell Master
Tuesday 30th April 1844

First part of these 24 hours light squalls of hail and more moderate course East wind W & W. Middle part calm but the keels set Main Top & Sail and took them in again closed the Top Sails until as usual Long 113° 52' W Lat 48° 11'

Wednesday 1st May

First part of these 24 hours a fresh gale from S & W under closed keels course East Middle part moderate squalls and clear - set the Main sail course E by S Long 110° 35' West Lat 48° 41' South

Thursday 2nd April

First part of these 24 hours equally under 2 Reef Top Sails and courses course E by S wind S W and plenty hail and snow Middle part under single Reefs Main Top & Sail set fresh gale from W & W Long 106° 25' W Lat 49° 35'

Friday 3rd April

First part of these 24 hours fresh gale from W & W course East Middle part fine all sail set Top & Sail latter part set Main Royal wind West Long 102° 15' West Lat 50° 13' South

Saturday 4th April

First part of these 24 hours fine and calm East wind W & W course East all sail out Middle part varying wind West latter part thick wind W & W all sail set Long 98° 44' West Lat 50° 41'

Sunday 5th May

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from S W all sail out course East Middle part fine latter part more moderate and warm and light wind from the South saw Fairbanks Long 94° 46' West Lat 51° 16' S

Bound To Copenhagen

Monday 6th May 1844

First part of these 24 hours calm mixed fresh breeze from the N & E all sail out course E by latter part strong breeze and overcast Long 191° 30' West Lat 52° 20' North

Tuesday 7th May

First part of these 24 hours moderate winds from S & E course E by S Middle part wind N & S strong sail latter part wind N & W all sail out Long by Act 59° 00' West Lat by Act 53° 25'

Wednesday 8th May

First part of these 24 hours cloudy with a fine breeze from N & W all sail out course E by S Middle and latter part cloudy all sail studding sail Long 45° 50' West Lat 55° 05' S

Thursday 9th May

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from N & W all sail set course East Middle part same course E & E by latter part continues same Long 51° 11' West Lat 56° 10'

Friday 10th May

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from N & W course E by S & S by N took in lower studding sail at dark took in Main Royal Middle part took in 2nd S. Studding sail latter part in wind North under Top Sails and courses, course E by S & S by N Long 176° 00' West Lat 56° 00'

Saturday 11th May

First part of these 24 hours cloudy fresh winds from North under 7 Sails & courses E by S passed a English ship sailing to the W & W Middle part wind hauled to the West latter part light wind from N & W courses E & E all sail out Long 95° 03' West Lat 57° 10'

Sunday 12th May

First part of these 24 hours cloudy wind N & W all sail out course E & E Middle part again Reel the 3 Sails by the wind latter part very moderate wind N & E all sail out 2 points variation West making East course thermometer 42° Barometer indicates a shower or rain & W standing on 27 Long 15° 52' West Lat 57° 24' South
