

Ship Clifford Wayne of Fairhaven

Saturday 27th May 1864

From part Calm Middle light air from the E & E heading to the S & latter part fresh breeze from the S & E. Keels the Sails heading S by W.

Lat 40° 07' S Long 134° 55' E

Sunday 28th May

From part of these 24 hours strong winds from S & E heading S by W under Double Reef Sails thick and rainy middle part wind from the North drove ship to the S & E latter part strong winds from the West Coast S & E.

Lat 39° 06' S Long 156° 24' E

Monday 29th May

From part strong winds from S & W Coast S by E middle and latter parts calm and light wind from the North heading S & E.

Lat 37° 57' S Long 157° 06' E

Tuesday 30th May

From part fresh breezes from the North and thick and rainy heading S by W at sundown drove ship to the East middle and latter parts under Double Reef Sails a gale from the North.

Lat 38° 15' S Long 157° 10' E

Wednesday 31st May

From part of these 24 hours a gale from the S & W under Double Reef Sails main top sail and fore sail hoisted S & E middle part took in fore sail latter moderate S & E Sails Double Reefed Course S by E wind from West W.

Lat 37° 49' S Long 160° 9' E

Thursday 1st June

From part of these 24 hours strong winds from S & W by W steering S by E and veered under Double Reef middle and latter parts squally with strong breezes from the West W Coast S by E.

Lat 36° 15' S Long 161° 24' E

Friday 2nd June 1864

From part of these 24 hours fresh wind from the S & W under Double Reef and Courses Course S by E middle and latter parts fine sun fair breeze

Lat 34° 19' S Long 162° 46' E

Saturday 3rd June

From part of these 24 hours fine all sail out sails & old from S by East and that it Course S by East at sundown took in Sails middle and latter parts fresh breezes from the South heading to S & E under Double Reef.

Lat 32° 34' S Long 163° 48' E

Sunday 4th June

From part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S & E under Double Reef heading to the East squally weather middle parts under short sail latter parts squally heading S & E under Double Reef & Courses.

Lat 32° 05' S Long 163° 13' E

Monday 5th June

From part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S & E under Double Reef heading to the S & E at sundown took in sail wind S & E middle parts drove ship to the S & E wind S & E latter parts heading to the North fresh wind and squally.

Lat 31° 45' S Long 165° 30' E

Tuesday 6th June

From part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S & E heading to the S & E at 4 P.M. drove ship to the S & E at sundown took in Sails middle and latter parts a gale from the S & E and rainy heading to the S & E.

Lat 32° 30' S Long 165° 40' E

Wednesday 7th June

From part of these 24 hours a gale continuing from the S & E at sundown heading S & E moderate middle parts rainy latter parts strong gales and rainy drove ship to the South took in fore sail heading S by W.

Lat 34° 00' S Long 165° 30' E
