Saturday 3rd March 1849

Some part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather wind West Course East Middle parts Reading S S W latter parts Course S E fine weather wind W to S W

Lat 33° 21' S Long 174° 24' E

Sunday 4th March

Some part fine light wind from the West Course S Middle parts Reading S E by E latter parts S E by E fine pleasant weather wind South

Lat 32° 42' S Long 175° 37' E

Monday 5th March

Some part of this day fine pleasant weather Reading S by E wind S S E much and latter parts same fine weather nearly calm

Lat 32° 21' S Long 176° 16' E

Tuesday 6th March

Some part fine weather and the fine and no whales middle and latter first rate wind West heading to the North

Lat 31° 40' S Long 176° 34'

Wednesday 7th March

Some part fine pleasant first rate weather wind W by W Reading W by E sundown took in Course S Middle parts fine heading S E latter parts same saw 1 ship steering to the E by E broke out from a Ground S by S Gallon back part out Noona Hole & rather a salt water Cask S S P (make also shook one of his Make 5 broken Staves in it 381 Gallon Cask)

Lat 31° 40' S Long 177° 56' E

Thursday 8th March

Some part of these 24 hours fine wind S S W heading to the S E at sundown took in Sails Middle & latter fine heading W S W

Lat 31° 53' Long 177° 18' E

Friday 9th March

Some part fine weather wind South heading W S W middle and latter parts light wind from S S E heading to the S W

Lat 31° 48' S Long 176° 43'

On New Zealand

Saturday 10th March 1849

Some part of these 24 hours fine weather wind light from the S S E heading to the S W 2 sail in sight Middle and latter parts fine pleasant weather heading S by S 3 sail in sight

Lat 32° 05' S Long by the Elia 176° 10' E

Sunday 11th March

Some part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather wind S E heading to the S S W saw 3 sail to day saw Blackfish & Tullies Middle fine and pleasant heading S by E latter fine fine three from the East at 10 A M saw Whales another ship nearest to them at 11 lowered whales going quick to the S S W West chasing

Lat 32° 27' S Long 175° 35' E

Monday 12th March

Some part fine weather at 3 P M struck the Lurboard Boat and got storm struck to the Mast Boat and the Lur at 5 took him alongside Middle parts fine wind S E by E 6 commenced cutting from our new nipper broke up log & parting

Lat 32° 41' S Long 175° 17' E

Tuesday 13th March

Some part fine weather choppy fresh breeze from the North at sundown finished cutting heading to the East Middle parts choppy and got to Boiling latter parts same fine weather

Lat 32° 54' S Long 175° 15' E

Wednesday 14th March

Some part fine light wind from W saw Ship to the S W Boiling junk Middle and latter parts fine weather wind S E by E heading to the North saw a ship chasing whales they going S W

Lat 32° 35' S Long 174° 53' E

Thursday 15th March

Some part of these 24 hours fine Boiling fresh breezes from the E by E heading North Middle parts strong winds latter parts same fine Boiling

Lat 31° 50' S Long 174° 42' E
