

Ship Clifford: Wagon Co. Fair Haven

Thursday 27th March 1849

From part of these 24 hours strong wind from the W & W leading to the South side Double Peak 1 Blk in sight - midle and latter fresh wind from the W & W.

Lat 33° 46' S Long 175° 00' E.

Friday 30th March

From part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the W & W spoke Blk & Champion of about 3 months from Sydney 30th March and 53 months from Cape of Good Hope. Midle and latter strong W & W winds.

Lat 33° 09' S Long 175° 13' E

Saturday 31st March

From part of these 24 hours strong wind from the West leading to the S & W the Blk in sight - midle strong gale and squally at day light saw Whales going to the E & E slow strong gales and heavy squalls heard 3 boats and Master Boat went on dented and did not fasten. very rugged and rainy seas. The remainder part of the forenoon wind S & W.

Lat 32° 04' S Long 175° 00' E

Sunday 1st April

From part strong gales and rugged whales in sight going to the West however best could not make out anything wind S & W midle part moderate latter part light wind from the South 1 Blk in sight.

Lat 31° 36' S Long 175° 47' E

Monday 2nd April

From part fine light air from the South leading to the East midle and latter part Calm saw grasshoppers

Lat 31° 50' S Long 175° 49' E

Tuesday 3rd April

From part of this day Calm midle part light wind from the S & E strong & latter part fresh wind and cloudy the Blk & C in sight

Lat 32° 41' S Long 175° 20' E

Wednesday 4th April 1849

From part of this day fresh wind from the S & E leading to the S & W cloudy weather at sundown took in sail today & S & E midle part strong wind and cloudy latter part from S to the N & W thick & rainy

Lat 32° 30' S Long 175° 05' E

Thursday 5th April

From part strong gales from S & E to North midle part thick latter part foggy wind West W leading S & W

Lat 32° 47' S Long 175° 10' E

Friday 6th April

From part of this day fresh wind from the West & S & E midle part moderate breeze from the S & W 1 Blk in sight at 4 PM saw whales going shore to the E & E however I and touch to the Larkland Mouth at 12 meridian 175° 15'

Lat 32° 42' S Long 175° 20' E

Saturday 7th April

From part light wind from W & W with foggy squalls at 2 PM took over Whales alongside at 4 PM began to sail at 8 PM the body in midle part leading to the South by head midle part took in head and sailed the case wind West fine weather a few squalls

Lat 32° 44' S Long 175° 30' E

Sunday 8th April

From part of this day light wind from the West commenced Boiling fine weather leading on the South side midle part took in head and sailed the case wind West Boiling

Lat 32° 26' S Long 175° 25' E

Monday 9th April

From part of these 24 hours fine weather and W & W 2 ship 1 Blk in sight at sundown took in sail spoke ship, heard same midle and latter part wind S & W Boiling

Lat 32° 30' S Long 175° 46' E
