From part of these 24 hours fine weather
Boiling wind S.E. leading to the S.W. middle part finished
Boiling latter part fine light airs from S.E.

Wednesday 11th April

From part fine light airs from S.E.
Steering down Larkwood Side from Hatch to aft middle and latter
part fine weather Steered down 4 cuts main Hatch & Side

Lat 32° 36' S Long 175° 00' E

Thursday 12th April

From part of these 24 hours fresh wind
from the North heading to the West middle part away S.W. wind
Rough West and to South were Ship to the S.E. wind S.E.W.
and rising fresh gales

Lat 32° 32' S Long 174° 55' E

Friday 13th April

From part strong gales from the S.W.
leading S.E. under Double Reef at sundown took in Sail middle
and latter part a gale under Closest Reef main Top Sail & 3rd
Sail in leading S.E. Lat 32° 42' S Long 175° 34'

Saturday 14th April

From part of these 24 hours a gale
from the S.W. and clear under Closest Reef main Top Sail
leading S.E. at sundown wore Ship to the S.W. middle part heading
West latter part wore Ship to the S.E. still a gale

Lat 32° 21' S Long 175° 13'

Sunday 15th April

From part a gale from S.W. leading
S.E. under Closest Reef main Top Sail middle part sum-
mer part moderate on little sail Double Reef Top Sails
leading to the S.W. by West

Lat 32° 07' S Long 175° 20' E

Monday 16th April 1849

From part of these 24 hours strong wind
from the S.E. and ruggish under Double Reef leading to the S.W.
middle and latter part fresh breezes from S.E. leading on the latter took
in (Tone of Sail) Lat 32° 19' S Long 174° 20' E 6 hrs

Tuesday 17th April 6 hrs 21.50

From part of this day moderate wind from
S.E. saw 21 Breach on Weather Beam 7 miles off at sundown took
in Top Leading S.E. middle light wind hauled to the S.E. & E
latter light and cloudy wind S.W.

Lat 32° 38' S Long 174° 45' E

Wednesday 18th April

From part finished 2nd Top Sail
and bent it under W.W. and hauled in a gale to S.W.
latter part Top Sails rising middle and latter part fine calm
Lat 32° 41' S Long 174° 35' E

Thursday 19th April

From part calm middle and latter part
light air breaking out from 4th found ground rotten
Lat 32° 40' S Long 175° 57'

Friday 20th April

From part calm much light wind
S.E. latter part fresh wind and squally wore S.W. to the S.W.
Lat 32° 46' S Long 175° 00'

Saturday 21st April

From part fresh breeze from S.E. & E
leading S.W. at sundown wore Ship to the East middle part came
to rain latter part fresh gale from the S.E. & E and rising at 4
miles wore Ship to the S.E. Lat 32° 46' S Long 175° 21'

Sunday 22nd April

From part rising wind East at sundown
up Ship leading to the S.E. wind light middle part calm and rising
then heavy swell from the S.E. and from the East latter part same
Lat 32° 50' S Long 175° 10' E
