Remarks On Board Wednesday 11th December 1844

First part of the 24 hours fine weather and fresh trades all sail set by the wind Middle and latter parts strong trades blowing up S by W by W set up the Head Rigging and employed at various other jobs

Long 27° 45' West Lat by Obs 51° 15' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 12th December

First part of these 24 hours fine weather with strong trades all sail set heading S by W, sail for sight steering to the S by W Middle and latter parts strong Breezes all sail set as usual 1 Sail in sight people employed at Ship's Duty

Long 24° 21' West Lat by Obs 7° 33' South

Remarks On Board Friday 13th December

First part of these 24 hours strong Trades from the S E all sail set heading up S by W took down our Fore Spinnaker Mast and Rigged away Mizzen and latter part very strong Trades no alteration otherwise Watched employed at Ship's Duty

Long 29° 00' West Lat by Obs 10° 16' South

Remarks On Board Saturday Dec 14th

First part of these 24 hours fine weather and strong Trades from the S E by E all sail set Middle parts same latter parts fine wind quite moderate laying up South employed in painting Ship and Boats

Long 29° 30' West Lat by Obs 13° 57' South

Remarks On Board Sunday Dec 15th

First part of these 24 hours fine weather and moderate Trades from the E S E by the wind South Middle parts wind east steering S by E latter parts South wind fresh all sail set

Long 29° 24' West Lat by Obs 15° 33' South

Remarks On Board Monday Dec 16th

First part of these 24 hours fine weather all sail with moderate Trades from the E S E by the wind to the South at 4 P M spoke French King Inessa of Marlow Middle and latter parts moderate Trades from the E S E

Long 28° 55' West Lat by Obs 17° 50' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday Dec 17th

First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather moderate Trades from the E S E all sail out by the wind at 6 P M Course South Middle and latter parts moderate at 9 A M Made the Island of Providence at 12 A M bore W S W by Compass 7 Leagues distant people employed at setting up Rigging

Long 28° 35' West Lat by Obs 20° 07' South

Remarks On Board Wednesday Dec 18th

First part of these 24 hours fine steering for Martin Vaz at 3 P M lowered 2 Boats and pulled up to fish at Landain came off and wore Ship Course S E by S wind S E by E Middle parts very light winds latter parts same set Fore Ship Mast steering Sail & Ship in sight, employed at setting up Rigging Fore and aft

Remarks On Board Thursday Dec 19th 1844

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the S E Course S E by S set the Fore Steering Sail & S Steering Sail Middle and latter parts fine Breezes from the S E & no alteration otherwise 1 Ship in sight steering to the East employed at setting up Rigging

Long 26° 42' West Lat by Obs 122° 46' East

Remarks On Board Friday 20th Dec

First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all sail set heading S E by S Course S E by S Middle and latter parts fine Breezes from the S E & no alteration otherwise 1 Ship in sight steering to the North

Long 25° 15' West Lat by Obs 24° 21' South

Remarks On Board Saturday 21st Dec

First part of these 24 hours fine Breezes from S E and pleasant weather all sail set with steering sails Course S E by S Middle parts fine Breezes latter parts no alterations in the wind and weather 1 Sail in sight steering to the S E, painted the Mizzen Mast and Larboard Boat at ends these 24 hours

Long 23° 19' West Lat by Obs 26° 23' South

Remarks On Board Sunday 22nd Dec

First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather wind S E by E all sail set Course S E by S Middle parts no alterations in the weather Course S E latter parts fresh Breezes from the S E & Course S E by E all sail set 1 Ship in sight

Long 20° 21' West Lat by Obs 28° 05' South

Remarks On Board Monday 23rd Dec

First part of these 24 hours fresh Breezes from the S E by E with light squalls of rain split the Main Top Steering Sail Course S E by E Middle parts moderate latter parts Course S E by E wind S E by E saw Pinbacks people employed at tarring down and other jobs

Long 18° 36' West Lat by Obs 29° 06' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 24th Dec

First part of these 24 hours moderate Breezes from the North all sail set repaired the M S S Steering Sail and Mast set it Course S E by E Middle parts same latter fresh Breezes saw Wharves suffered them to be jumped

Long 17° 06' West Lat by Obs 30° 13' South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 25th Dec

First part of these 24 hours moderate Breezes from the S E by E all sail set Course S E by E finished tarring down Middle parts wind fresh from the South Doubled Ropes the Top Sails latter parts fresh Sails from the S E by the wind to the East

Long 14° 25' West Lat by Obs 30° 04' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 26th Dec

First part of these 24 hours fresh Sails from the S E under Light Reef Top Sails and Courses by the wind to the East Middle parts no alterations latter same from the S E by the wind to the South under which Top Sails and Courses with a heavy swell from the South
