First part of these 24 hours light air and calm and overcast Middle part light wind from the S.W. to S.W. latter part strong breeze from the S.W. course S.E. by E. 1/2 E all hawking sail set saw a Finback

Long 130° 29' West Lat by Obs 38° 14' South

Remarks On Board Monday 13th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours strong wind from S.W. at 4 P.M. hauled to the West 20 and many of 5 changed up wind from the West to S.W. all sail set took in stormy sails course S.E. by E Middle part wind South steering full by latter part wind hauling tacked Ship to the South wind S.E. and fine weather employed at Ship Duty and getting stove boards

Long 32° 31' East Lat by Obs 38° 27' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 14th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours fine weather fresh breeze from the S.E. clearing by the wind to the S.E. at 2 P.M. took in Sails Mizzen & Sails Middle part took in Main Sails and Jib and hatter parts wind S.E. by E course S.E. by E 1/2 E employed at Ship Duty

Long 35° 25' East Lat by Obs 38° 44' South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 15th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours strong wind from the S.W. under Sails & courses course S.E. by E 1/2 E Middle part thickened on with thunder & lightning hauled the Main Sails & Sails the Sails wind S.W. latter a heavy sea and rainy broke the eye bolt in the hatter - Moderate down

Long 38° 58' East Lat by Obs 38° 57' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 16th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours all drawing sail set, wind fresh from the S.W. 20 course S.E. by E 1/2 E Middle part equally latter part wind strong from the S.W. all sail out saw plenty of whale back so ended these 24 hours with moderate gales

Remarks On Board Friday 17th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours moderate gales from the S.W. all sail set course S.E. by E 1/2 E Middle part no alterations latter part wind S.E. by the wind took in S. & Sails. Broke out Main Hatch for stove M.S. Sails

Long 46° 46' East Lat by Obs 38° 27' South

Remarks On Board Saturday 18th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours strong gales from the S.E. sent down our old Main Sails & Sails and put up a new one at sundown sundown single reefed the Sails Middle and latter part thick and it was wind hauled to the S.E. set Main Sails steering by the wind to the S.E. so ended these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Sunday 15th January 1845

First part of these 24 hours thick weather wind S.E. to S.E. under Sails & courses by the wind to the S.E. at 6 P.M. wore Ship to the South and doubled reefed the Sails steering by the wind Middle part thick and rainy latter took in Sails & Mizzen Sails laying under Bowed Reefed Main Sails & Sails, S. & Sails, Sails heading South

Long by Acc 49° 53' East Lat by Acc 37° 41' South

Remarks On Board Monday 20th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours a Gale from the East closed kept the Main Sails heading by the wind to the S.E. with thick and rainy weather Middle part moderate wind Made sail latter parts wind S.E. and thick all sail out course S.E. by E

Long 51° 37' East Lat by Obs 39° 01' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 21st Jan.

First part of these 24 hours thick and foggy weather all sail set wind S.E. by E course S.E. by E 1/2 East Middle part thick and rainy latter part the wind S.E. by E with strong gales and foggy

Long 55° 17' East Lat by Obs 39° 28' South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 22nd Jan.

First part of these 24 hours wind S.E. by S course S.E. took in Sails with strong gales and foggy Middle and latter part more moderate wind S.W. 20 all sail out employed in repairing Main Sails & Sails and making Bore spun Yarn saw Finbacks

Long 58° 07' East Lat by Obs 39° 41' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 23rd Jan.

First part of these 24 hours fine wind S.W. all sail set, course S.E. Middle part strong wind latter part same saw 3 finbacks nothing more Remarkable employed at various jobs & repairing Main Sails & Sails

Long 63° 26' East Lat by Obs 39° 34' S

Remarks On Board Friday 24th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the S.W. & S.W. in our stormy sail and Sails Sails & Sails Middle and latter part no alterations in the weather set the Sails steering Sails wind S.W. saw a Finback

Long 67° 31' East Lat by Obs 39° 10' South

Remarks On Board Saturday 25th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours wind S.W. all sail out course S.E. by S at 4 P.M. course S.E. by S thick foggy weather Middle part wind light from the S.W. latter cleared off wind from the S.W. and calm

Long 70° 32' East Lat by Obs 38° 42' South

Remarks On Board Sunday 26th Jan.

First part of these 24 hours calm at 4 light air from the S.W. by E, course S.E. by S Middle and latter part thick foggy weather wind from the west all sail set at 10 changed up saw Finbacks
