Remarks On Board Friday 2nd February 1845

First part of these 24 hours fine weather. Moderate Breezes from the S E all Sail set by the wind at the S E W Middle and latter parts with light Boffing Breezes from the South tucked Ship to the East wind hauled to the South

Long 104° 36 East Lat by Obs 34° 48 South

Remarks On Board Saturday 3rd March 1845

First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather. wind S E W Course S E by E all Sail set for East Coast N 7/8 E Middle parts wind West latter parts wind S W set S E. M. Steering Sail with fresh Breezes and Cloudy

Long 107° 30 East Lat by Obs 35° 48 S

Remarks On Board Sunday 4th March

First part of these 24 hours fresh Breezes from the West to S W. Course S E by E all Drawing Sail set with a heavy swell from the South caught a Porpoise Middle parts same latter parts Course S E by E wind Noffing from West to S W with light squalls

Long by Acet 110° 41 East Lat by Obs 36° 51 South

Remarks On Board Monday 5th March

First part of these 24 hours fresh Breezes from the W N W Course S E by E all Sail set at sundown took in Steering Sail, caught the Porpoise Middle and latter no alteration in wind and weather Course S E

Long 113° 55 East Lat by Obs 37° 34 South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 6th March

First part of these 24 hours fresh Sails from the W N W all Sail set Course S E by E Middle parts Moderate latter wind hauled to the South with light and calm

Long 116° 30 East Lat by Obs 38° 07 South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 7th March

First part of these 24 hours Moderate Breezes from the East hailing by the wind to the South Middle up to S E took in Top & Sails latter parts Steering Breezes Doubled Reefed the Top Sails

Long 118° 34 East Lat by Obs 39° 51 South

Remarks On Board Thursday 8th March

First part of these 24 hours strong wind from the E S E at 5 P M turned Reefed out M T Sails and set M J. S. Sails Middle and latter light wind from the East and thick foggy weather saw a Finback

Long by Acet 119° 55 East Lat by Acet 40° 57 S

Remarks On Board Friday 9th March

First part of these 24 hours thick foggy weather and calm Middle parts same latter parts light Breezes from the S W at 11 A M changed off set the S J M Steering Sail Course E by S employed at various jobs

Long 120° 05 East Lat by Obs 41° 24 South

For the East Coast New Holland

Remarks On Board Saturday 8th March 1845

First part of these 24 hours light Breezes from the West all Sail set Course E by S Middle parts same wind from S W to S W latter parts fresh Breezes and Cloudy

Long 122° 54 East Lat by Obs 41° 34 South

Remarks On Board Sunday 9th March

First part of these 24 hours fresh Sails from the W N W to S W and squally with rain all Sail set Course E by S N S Middle parts more Moderate latter parts same all Drawing sail set Course E by S

Long 126° 35 East Lat by Obs 41° 50 South

Remarks On Board Monday 10th March

First part of these 24 hours fine weather all Sail out Course E by S N S wind West to W Middle and latter parts wind S W with a few squalls of rain Course E by S

Long 130° 39 East Lat by Obs 42° 25 South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 11th March

First part of these 24 hours fair weather and oronest wind S W, all Sail set Course E by S Middle and latter parts wind S W nothing more remarkable

Long 134° 45 East Lat by Obs 43° 04 South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 12th March

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the North and thick Course E by S at 4 P M took in Top & Sails at sundown rainy squalls Reefed the Top Sails at 9 took up Double Reefed latter parts more Moderate all Sail set

Long by Acet 138° 46 East Lat by Acet 43° 52 South

Remarks On Board Thursday 13th March

First part of these 24 hours a Gale from the West took in Waste Boat at 3 P M took in Mizzen Top Sail Course E by S Middle parts heavy squalls latter parts wind from the S W and rainy Double Reefed set the Main Sail Course East

Long 142° 40 East Lat by Obs 44° 40 South

Remarks On Board Friday 14th March

First part of these 24 hours wind hauled to the West and cleared up a Gale and a heavy sea Course East hauled Mid. Sail set Main Top Sail & Top & Sail Middle parts more Moderate Made all Sail latter parts Course East wind S W

Long 147° 09 East Lat by Obs 44° 50 South

Remarks On Board Saturday 15th March

First part of these 24 hours fresh Sails from the S W and Cloudy all Sail set Course E by E Middle parts light air and calm at daylight fresh Breezes from the South at 8 A M took in Top & Sail jib and flanks at 11 A M took in Mizzen Top Sail and closed Reefed the Main, dorying the S E wind S W at 11 A M a Gale

Long 149° 25 East Lat by Obs 44° 31 South

Remarks On Board Sunday 16th March

First part of these 24 hours a Gale from the S W at 3 P M set closed Reefed Top Sails leading at 6 A M a Squall from the West Course S E by E Middle parts Moderate winds from S W Made all Sail latter parts wind from S W all drawing sail set Course same with fine weather

Long 151° 48 East Lat by Obs 43° 30 South
