Remarks On Board Monday 17th March 1845

First part of these 24 hours fine weather from the S.W. and clear all Drawing sail set Course S.E. Middle parts fine weather wind hauled to the S.E. latter parts wind S.E. by the wind starboard Tacks employed in breaking out After Hatch
Long 153° 08' East Lat by Obs 42° 24' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 18th March 1845

First part of these 24 hours fine weather all Sail set wind blowing from S.E. to S.W. by E at 6 P.M. backed Ship to the East took in light Sails at 10 P.M. to the S.W. Middle parts Strong Breezes Doubled? Tacks? Up Sails latter strong gales from the S.W. took in fore & main of Sails and fore Sail work Ship to the east with rain and some lightning
Long by Acc 153° 21' East Lat by Obs 40° 44' South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 19th March

First part of these 24 hours rain at 2 P.M. wind from the S.E. Made Sail Course S.E. by S.W. Middle parts wind S.E. latter parts wind S.W. employed at breaking out Main Hatch and cooping Broad
Long 153° 49' East Lat by Obs 40° 14' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 20th March

First part of these 24 hours cooping Broad wind from the S.W. and main Course S.E. Middle parts wind changed to the S.W. Course S.E. by S.W. latter parts fresh Breezes and cloudy
Long 156° 38' East Lat by Obs 38° 30' South

Remarks On Board Friday 21st March

First part of these 24 hours strong Breezes from the South all Sail set Course S.E. by S.W. Middle and latter parts light winds and squally from the S.W.
Long 158° 10' East Lat by Obs 37° 08' South

Remarks On Board Saturday 22nd March

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the S.W. all Sail set Course S.E. by S.W. fine pleasant weather Middle part fine light winds saw Blackish latter parts fine Course S.E. by S.W.
Long by Acc 155° 56' East Lat by Acc 36° 00' S

Remarks On Board Sunday 23rd March

First part of these 24 hours fresh Breezes from the South and squally Course S.E. by S.W. at sundown took in Sail and Reel Main Top Sail heading to the East Middle parts very rainy latter parts squally with rain from the S.E. set Double Reel of Sails
Long 161° 15' East Lat by Obs 35° 30' South

Remarks On Board Monday 24th March

First part of these 24 hours strong Breezes from the S.W. and squally steering to the S.W. under Double Reel of Sails and Courses at sundown took in Sail from Ship to the South Middle parts light winds from the W. to S.W. by the wind starboard Tacks latter parts made all Sail to the West wind fresh S.E. to S.W. steering of to the S.W. at 11 A.M. a squall from the S.E. Doubled? Reel? the Top Sails so ends
Long 159° 18' East Lat by Obs 35° 24' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 25th March 1845

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S.W. to S.E. by the wind to the West at sundown took in Sail and work Ship to the East Middle parts fine latter parts heading to the S.E. saw Grampies nothing more remarkable
Long 159° 12' East Lat by Obs 35° 31' South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 26th March

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the Westward heading to the South all Sail out under Main Top Sail and Top I Sail and other bent New Top Top Sail at sundown took in Sail and work ship to the S.W. Middle parts fine at daylight made all Sail to the S.W. saw a Hump back, employed at repairing. Store Top Sail so ends then 21 hours
Long 158° 48' East Lat by Obs 35° 22' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 27th March

First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather wind moderate from the S.E. and South heading to the East at sundown took in Sail Middle and latter parts fine at daylight made all Sail and stood to the S.W. repaired fore Top Sail and bent it
Long 159° 09' East Lat by Obs 35° 31' South

Remarks On Board Friday 28th March

First part of these 24 hours squally from the South at 2 P.M. more Ship to the East at sundown took in Sail Middle parts fine latter parts more Ship to the S.W. all Sail set repairing Main Top Sail
Long 158° 44' East Lat by Obs 35° 41' South

Remarks On Board Saturday 29th March

First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all Sail set at 2 P.M. took in Ship to the S.E. fine S.E. by S.W. at sundown took in Sail as usual Middle parts fine from the S.E. more Ship to the East latter parts fine pleasant all Sail set
Long 159° 58' East Lat by Obs 35° 51' South

Remarks On Board Sunday 30th March

First part of these 24 hours fine and pleasant light wind from the North heading to the S.E. at sundown more Ship to the West and took in Sail Middle parts fine latter parts made all sail to the West fine weather at 12 Midian took in Ship to the East
Long 159° 33' East Lat by Obs 35° 46' South

Remarks On Board Monday 31st March

First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather with light winds from the North heading to the East at sundown took in Sail to the S.E. Middle parts more Ship to the S.W. at daylight fine Made all Sail at 8 A.M. raised Sperm Whales at 1 P.M. 9. however for them they going quick to the S.E. could not strike chased them untill 12 O'clock then came on Board Moderate Breezes from the S.E.
Long 159° 16' East Lat by Obs 35° 46' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 1st April

First part of these 24 hours fine weather with moderate winds from the S.E. by E heading to the South at sundown Doubled? Reel? Top Sails Middle parts fine latter same Made all Sail at 8 A.M. backed Ship to the South at noon took in Ship to the S.E. employed in repairing Main Top Sail
Long 159° 13' East Lat by Obs 35° 55' South
