

Ship Clifford Wagner of Fairhaven & J. Howland Master  
 Remarks On Board Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1845  
 First part of these 24 hours strong trades from the E & E under double reefed top sails  
 up the reef at sundown under double reefed top sails & under the reefed middle and  
 latter parts rainy thick weather with light S.W. breeze the storm sail

Remarks On Board Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours strong S.W. breeze from the E & E under double reefed top sails  
 down sail justly laying of and in the fore with thick cloudy weather middle and latter parts  
 down with with squalls of rain

Remarks On Board Monday 5<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours fine breeze from the E & E with heavy squalls & showers  
 ran down to the passage and sent 2 boats ashore trading and set up anything at sundown  
 same on board and stood off middle moderate breezes latter parts calm employed at breaking  
 out main hatch for water and repairing old boat now change the boom stay current setting  
 to the east

Remarks On Board Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours calm at sundown light air from the east took in sail  
 heading to the E & E middle parts light breezes from the S & E latter parts fine  
 pleasant weather all sail set repaired jib mending boat and blocks mending

Remarks On Board Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours pleasant weather moderate breezes from the east  
 all sail set backing to and off at sundown took in sail as usual heading off shore  
 middle parts fine latter same all sail set repairing main sail  
 Lat 16° 13' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours fresh trades from the S & E at 4 P.M. raised breeches  
 1 point on weather now supposed to be from Whales heading in for the land wind S & E  
 at sundown shortened sail and wore ship inshore middle and latter parts fresh breezes  
 backing off and in repaired main sail and haul it saw a whale to windward  
 Long 179° 47' East

Remarks On Board Friday 9<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours fine weather with moderate breezes all sail set course  
 S & E by E middle and latter parts fresh breezes all sail set for Rotterdam  
 Long 178° 23' East Lat by Obs 13° 39' South

Remarks On Board Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours fresh trades from the S & E by E course S & W by W  
 all sail set middle parts shortened sail at daylight Rotterdam bore S & E distant  
 10 leagues latter parts squally rainy weather standing in for the land

Remarks On Board Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours squally in between Emerald Island and the main island  
 with strong breezes and calm at 6 A.M. left us let go our anchor in 20 fathoms  
 south of Emerald Island bore N & E distant 3 miles and forced the sails middle parts  
 strong breezes and rain at daylight got under way and stood in let go our anchor  
 in 15 fathoms weather the point bearing S & E and the bluff N & W and guided  
 the ship

## Coff Tackamora Slave Islands

Remarks On Board Monday 12<sup>th</sup> May 1845  
 First part of these 24 hours strong breezes 1 watch ashore got our coals ashore for  
 water middle and latter parts rainy employed at various jobs and trading Peter Russell  
 Deserter

Remarks On Board Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours rainy 1 watch ashore middle parts fine wind from  
 the E & E middle same latter parts 1 watch ashore William Dean Brother and  
 George Lynch Deserter got 500 lb water and Yams and Beans etc

Remarks On Board Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> May  
 First part of these 24 hours fine weather storing down water and trading  
 middle and latter parts fine pleasant weather getting of recruits  
 Long 177° 34' East Lat by Obs 12° 25' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 15<sup>th</sup>  
 First part of these 24 hours fine got of all our recruits and shipped 3 men viz  
 Daniel Wilson and George Hall and Thomas Edwards at 3 took our anchor and stood  
 out to the east wind S & E at sunset got our anchors stowed and Decks clean all  
 sail set middle and latter parts fine backing as the wind showed us to lay up at  
 12 O'clock Rotterdam bore at 20 distant 20 miles  
 Lat by Obs 12° 40' South

Remarks On Board Friday 16<sup>th</sup>  
 First part of these 24 hours fine moderate breezes from the S & E by E all sail  
 set laying on the Southern tack saw breeches at sundown the Island bore N & W  
 distant 30 miles middle parts fine latter parts fine no alterations in the wind  
 Long 178° 27' East Lat by Obs 12° 52' South

Remarks On Board Saturday 17<sup>th</sup>  
 First part of these 24 hours pleasant breezes from the S & E laying on each  
 tack all sail set bent our new jib jib middle parts in the wind & by E latter  
 parts backed to the S & W strong trades  
 Long 179° 09' East Lat by Obs 12° 45' South

Remarks On Board Sunday 18<sup>th</sup>  
 First part of these 24 hours fresh trades from the S & E by the wind to the South  
 took in foremast Mizzen 2d sail and jib jib middle parts same latter parts more  
 moderate laying up S & by E all sail set  
 Long 178° 09' East Lat by Obs 15° 04' South

Remarks On Board Monday 19<sup>th</sup>  
 First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the S & E at 3 P.M. took  
 ship to the S & E by E middle and latter parts fine light winds at 9 A.M. saw Round  
 Island  
 Long 177° 52' East Lat by Obs 16° 21' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup>  
 First part of these 24 hours pleasant light breezes from the East at sundown  
 the Island distant 5 miles Round Island bore E & by E distant 10 miles backed to the  
 S & E middle parts light air latter parts light wind from E & S & by E all sail  
 set heading to the Eastward  
 Long Lat by Obs 16° 41' South
