Remarks On Board Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> July 1845

First part of these 24 hours from moderate at sundown turned  
1 out main top sail middle parts made sail latter parts all sail out and  
under Double Reef also so E & S with squally weather

Remarks On Board Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours strong trades under 2 Reef top  
Sails took in pit and 2 Rankin saw Whalesh Middle parts took in fore & Mizzen  
top sails latter parts rigger under Double Reef run off under the sea of Sears the  
L P in sight

Remarks On Board Friday 18<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours strong trades having off on under  
the sea of Sears at sundown closed Reefed the top sails and stored the middle parts  
squally latter parts a Gale took in the Mizzen top sails with heavy rain

Remarks On Board Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours rain at sundown more moderate  
set closed Reefed top sails heading of them at 10 AM with E & S middle parts same latter  
parts under 2 Reef top sails pit and Rankin the L P in sight

Remarks On Board Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours quite moderate feeling up to  
underval of Sears at sundown light wind from the E & S middle parts light air for the  
W & W course & E & S latter parts calm the L P in sight and ship of Furwell Island

Remarks On Board Monday 21<sup>st</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours calm at sundown light air  
from W & W Double Reef the top sails middle and latter parts light air and  
Cullens repairing Gunter and Blacksmithing

Remarks On Board Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours calm at sundown shortened sail  
middle and latter parts light air and calm the L P in sight

Remarks On Board Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours fine nearly calm middle  
and latter parts light air from E & S latter parts same all sail set

Remarks On Board Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours sun fresh Trades in  
company with the L P at sundown took in sail middle parts strong Trades  
latter under Double Reef top sails

Remarks On Board Friday 25<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours a light Gale from the  
E & S at 4 P M saw Boatswain's ship from them about Whales at sundown they  
were the windward closed Reefed the top sails heading South middle parts same  
latter parts under Double Reef with strong Gales the L P in sight nothing  
more remarkable

Off Blackanova Blue Islands & Rotumah

Remarks On Board Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours fresh Gales from the  
East under 2 Reef top sails at sundown closed Reefed the top sails middle parts  
same latter parts strong Trades at 11 AM put away for Rotumah in company  
with the L Packet for recruits and water after cruising at the request months  
and finding whales scarce course E & S W Long 179° 34' East Lat 16° 03' South

Remarks On Board Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours strong Trades under Double  
Reef top sails course E & W of middle parts same latter parts heavy weather  
the L P in sight

Remarks On Board Monday 28<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours light wind from E & S  
and rainy under 2 Reef and courses at sundown closed reef middle parts light air  
and calm latter parts light breeze from the S.W. at daylight took in the fore & main  
mizzen hatch and stowed down the fore sail in the ground

Long 177° 14' East Lat 14° 11' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours light wind from the E & S the L Packet  
in sight at sundown single reefed the top sails course E & W middle parts same latter parts  
light wind from E & S at 9 AM saw Rotumah bearing in the distance

Remarks On Board Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours light wind from the E & S  
and calm the L P in company 1 other sail in sight at sundown took in the fore & main  
and of the Mizzen middle parts lapping off and on at daylight made all sail and  
steered in for the harbour in company with the L Packet saw the 12<sup>th</sup> Arabian of London  
14 miles from Sidney with 410<sup>th</sup> sail

Remarks On Board Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> July

First part of these 24 hours of the harbour at 1 came to  
in 12 fathoms water and double reefed the sails set a raft of Casks ready for water and washed  
ship middle parts rainy latter parts sent the raft

Remarks On Board Friday 1<sup>st</sup> August

First part of these 24 hours rainy middle parts same latter parts  
latter parts fine weather

Remarks On Board Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> August

First part of these 24 hours fine took our raft of water  
off and took it in middle parts rainy latter parts stank down main hatch our water

Remarks On Board Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> August

Embargo stowing down casks for water and got a  
raft ashore middle parts fresh Trades latter parts same came in at anchor a buoy  
from deeper bound to Manilla

Remarks On Board Monday 4<sup>th</sup> August

First part of these 24 hours fine middle parts rainy  
latter parts light squally and clear up by 1 of painting ship and taking of water  
Alonso Bales Deserted this day
