

# Ship Clifford Wayne of Fairhaven, E. J. Howland Master

Remarks On Board Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> August 1845  
First part of these 24 hours fine weather at 3 P M finished cutting took the case on Deck at sundown shortened sail to the West wind S E & W cleared up the Deck and got the works up on the middle part were ship to the East strong squalls with rain latter part were ship to the S W under Double Reefed Top Sails Boiling saw Humphbacks

Long 168° 31 East Lat by Obs 24° 06 S  
Remarks On Board Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> August  
First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S E under Double Reefed Top Sails the S W Boiling middle part finished Boiling latter part all sail set course W by S  
Long 166° 44 East Lat by Obs 23° 46 S

Remarks On Board Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> August  
First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from S E all sail set course S W by W at sundown single Reefed the Top Sails middle part same latter part Double Reefed the Top Sails course W S W  
Long 164° 22 East Lat by Obs 24° 32 S

Remarks On Board Monday 25<sup>th</sup> August  
First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the S E course W by S under Double Reefed Top Sails middle part same latter part fine weather at daylight broke out the board side made the deck and drove down our oil 40 lbs of gunpowder  
Long 162° 00 East Lat by Obs 24° 36 S

Remarks On Board Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> August  
First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the East finished stowing down course W by S middle no alterations latter part fine pleasant weather all sail set saw Pinbacks empty on the rigging  
Long 159° 51 East Lat by Obs 24° 35 S

Remarks On Board Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> August  
First part of these 24 hours pleasant weather all sail set course W by S at sundown took in S W under Top Sails and lay by the wind to the S E middle part were ship to the S W at daylight made all sail and S E saw Humphbacks at 4 P M saw a large body of Green Whales passed for them and struck to the Starboard Boat at 10 P M took him alongside the other 2 boats off got ready for cutting  
Long by Acc 159° 30 East Lat by Obs 24° 40 S

Remarks On Board Thursday 28<sup>th</sup>  
First part of these 24 hours cutting at 2 P M lowered for Whales 24 W boats the rest cutting at 5 P M struck a whale to the Starboard Boat 4 miles to the weather of the ship at 8 P M took him alongside at dark got our first whale in tow in sail middle part fine latter part same at daylight cleared the base at 9 commenced cutting at noon got the body in and ready for the Head  
Long 155° 12 East Lat by Obs 24° 52 S

Remarks On Board Friday 29<sup>th</sup> August  
First part of these 24 hours fresh squall of rain from the S W took in junk & case at 3 cleared the case at 4 P M got junk out and in the tank below commenced Boiling middle part fine at daylight finished the Head latter part fine Boiling light breezes from the S E stanch to the north  
Long 159° 51 East Lat by Obs 24° 19 S

# On The East Coast of New Holland.

Remarks On Board Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> August 1845  
First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather wind S E heading to the S E at sundown wore ship to the S and took in sail middle part fine latter part same at daylight made all sail stowing to the S W saw a great many Humphbacks employed at Boiling

Long 159° 12 East Lat 24° 05 South  
Remarks On Board Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> August  
First part of these 24 hours fine weather all sail set course S W wind East saw Humphbacks at 5 P M finished Boiling at sundown took in sail heading South middle part were ship to the South latter part squally saw Humphbacks  
Long 158° 24 East Lat 24° 13 South

Remarks On Board Monday 1<sup>st</sup> September  
First part of these 24 hours fine weather fresh breezes from the S E all sail set heading to the S E at sundown took in sail middle part fine latter part calm at daylight commenced stowing down main Hatch 70 lbs of gunpowder  
Long 175° 17 East Lat 24° 25 South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September  
First part light breezes from the South finished stowing at sundown cloudy took in sail to the East middle and latter part strong winds from the S E latter part under Top Sails to the S E by E  
Long 159° 16 East Lat 24° 00

Remarks On Board Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept  
First part strong breezes from the S E heading S E by E saw Humphbacks at sundown took in sail wore ship to the South middle squally latter part strong wind from the S E under Double Reefed Top Sails by the wind to the South parted from Top Mast flying Day  
Lat 24° 11 S

Remarks On Board Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> Sept  
First part of these 24 hours strong winds from S E by E under Double Reefed Top Sails saw Top Mast stay and other jibs at sundown took in sail by the wind to the South middle part made sail latter part fine all sail set heading S E by E employed a various job  
Long 158° 36 East Lat 24° 43 South

Remarks On Board Friday 5<sup>th</sup> Sept  
First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the S E by E by the wind S E with squalls of rain at sundown Double Reefed and started ship to the South middle part were ship to the South latter part fine all sail set  
Long 158° 12 East Lat 25° 16 South

Remarks On Board Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> Sept  
First part of this day under single Reefed Top Sails by the wind to the S at 4 P M saw 2 whales 2 miles off had one chance for them lowered the boats but did not get to them at dark came on board and took in sail heading to the S E wind S E middle part were ship to the South latter part fine all sail set  
Long 154° 14 East Lat 26° 57 South

Remarks On Board Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> Sept  
First part fine all sail out to the South in tow from Tail & main Top Sails and bent our second best at sundown took in sail heading S E middle part fresh breeze from the S E latter part same very irregular  
Long 158° 49 East Lat 26° 31 South
