First part of these 24 hours strong S.W. breeze from the S.E. heading to the S.E. at sundown took in fore & main top sails middle and latter parts no alterations under Double Reef to the S.E.

Remarks On Board Tuesday 10th Sept

First part strong wind and rigging heading to the South under 2 reefed top sails at sundown took in fore & main top sails middle parts were to the South with strong gales about the fore top sail in to repair fore & main top sails middle parts same latter under Double Reef to the South repaired the fore and bent it

Long 158° 34' East Lat 25° 15' S

Remarks On Board Wednesday 11th Sept

First part of these 24 hours strong S.W. breeze from the S.E. heading to the S under Double Reef at sundown took in fore & main top sails middle parts same latter under Double Reef to the South repaired the fore and bent it

Long 158° 43' East Lat 26° 34' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 12th Sept

First part of these 24 hours fresh S.W. breeze from the East under Double Reef top sails to the South at sundown took in fore & main top sails middle parts same latter under Double Reef to the South repaired the fore and bent it

Remarks On Board Friday 12th Sept

First part of these 24 hours fine weather course S.W. by S breaking out for weather at sundown took in fore & main top sails middle parts same latter under Double Reef to the South repaired the fore and bent it

Remarks On Board Saturday 13th Sept

First part squally with strong wind from the West and South by S at sundown took in fore & main top sails middle parts same latter under Double Reef to the South repaired the fore and bent it

Remarks On Board Sunday 14th Sept

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the S.E. all sail set steering by the wind to the S.W. at sundown took in fore & main top sails middle parts same latter under Double Reef to the South repaired the fore and bent it

Remarks On Board Monday 15th Sept

First part of these 24 hours light wind from the S.E. all sail set course S.W. by S at 2 P.M. saw a shoal of some Whales going quick to the S.E. at 3 P.M. lowered the South and struck to the Starboard and Larboard Boats at sundown took them alongside and took in sail and were off 40 fathoms middle parts strong S.W. breeze at daylight hauled them alongside and began to cut at 9 A.M. got the Wood in began to cut the other still blowing on and a heavy sea at 12 M. hauled in the other Wood in

Long 154° 36' East Lat 30° 45' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 16th Sept

First part a gale from the North shifted the 2 heads off and lay by them under close Reef. Main top sail heading to the Eastward. Middle parts once at daylight cleared up with light breeze from the S.W. took in fore & main top sails middle parts same latter under Double Reef to the South repaired the fore and bent it

Remarks On Board Wednesday 17th September

First part fine weather light wind from the West cleared away the head and cleared up the decks and commenced rolling the head wind. Ship to the S.E. at 7 P.M. began to rain wind hauled to the S.W. and blew a gale cooler down and got all East Middle a heavy gale and high sea latter parts same attended with heavy squalls

Remarks On Board Thursday 18th Sept

First part of these 24 hours the S.W. breeze moderate wind from the South at sundown the moderate down began to cut up our blacken middle parts moderated at 11 P.M. set the works going latter parts same attended with heavy squalls

Remarks On Board Friday 19th Sept

First part of these 24 hours fine weather moderate breeze from the South at 4 P.M. was ship to the S.W. Boiling middle parts strong breeze Boiling Head at daylight made sail double Reef top sails steering in 10 P.M. for the Land at 11 P.M. saw it smoky Cape

Long 153° 25' East Lat 31° 17' South

Remarks On Board Saturday 20th Sept

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the South under Double Reef top sails at sundown smoky Cape bore S.W. by S and the Land to the S.W. by W distant 12 miles took in sail heading off middle parts light wind latter parts calm steering down main Hatch

Long 153° 22' East Lat 32° 17' South

Remarks On Board Sunday 21st Sept

First part of these 24 hours light wind from the North steering S.W. by W at 5 P.M. finished steering down 65 fms from Oll at sundown took in sail the Land in sight middle parts fine steering a course under 6 reefed top sails main top sails fore sail latter parts same steering down the S.W. all sail set course S.W. by S saw Pin backs

Long 152° 39' East Lat 34° 05' South

Remarks On Board Monday 22nd Sept

First part of this day light wind from the S.W. and S.W. all sail set heading S.W. at sundown took in sail heading to the West Middle and latter parts light air and calm saw Pin backs employed in breaking out one starting thread into small casks

Long 152° 25' East Lat 34° 23' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 23rd Sept

First part of these 24 hours calm at sundown light air from the S.E. took in sail steering South Middle parts fine latter parts fresh breeze from the S.W. all sail set spoke through Lochna of 8 Mariner of Hobart Town

Long 153° 05' East Lat 35° 15' South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 24th Sept

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the North at sundown took in sail close Reefed the main top sail heading to the West Middle and latter parts a light gale from the S.W. by W in sight saw 3 Wright Whales going quick to the North

Long 151° 24' East Lat 35° 30' South

Remarks On Board Thursday 25th Sept

First part of these 24 hours strong S.W. breeze from the South under short sail at sundown moderated heading to the East Middle parts strong S.W. breeze latter parts moderated away made all sail steering to the East at 9 saw East Coast of New Holland at 11 A.M. saw 2 Wright Whales going quick to the S.E. lowered but did not overtake them
