Remarks On Board Friday 26th September 1845

Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather and calm saw plenty of backs at sundown light air from the S.E. doubled the top sails heading to the South the land bearing 10 by South distant 7 leagues middle parts light winds from the S.E. & latter part fine all sail set at 11 a.m. saw 1 bright whale going quick to the S.E. lowered but did not succeed in striking being very much

Long 152° 24 East Lat 34° 44 South

Remarks On Board Saturday 27th Oct

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S.E. at 3 P.M. saw a bright whale going quick to the S.E. lowered but did not strike at sundown took in sail to the East middle parts fine latter parts strong to the S.E. wind & north

Long 152° 18 East Lat 35° 10 S

Remarks On Board Sunday 28th Oct

First part of this day saw bright whales at 3 P.M. lowered for them did not strike very well and going quick to the S.E. at sundown took in sail heading to the East the Scrima in sight middle parts same at daylight made all sail to the W. & S. sail in sight 1 bright whale at 9 a.m. raised & lowered and struck to the West Boat at 10 a.m. took the whale alongside and commenced cutting at 11 lowered 2 boats for more whales but could not strike going quick to the S.E.

Remarks On Board Monday 29th Sept

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the North at 3 finished cutting cleared away the head and got ready at 9 P.M. commenced boiling took in sail heading to the East & East middle parts under short sail to the S.E. & sailing latter strong winds from the S. and raised at 10 a.m. lowered for whales but could not strike

Long 152° 48 East Lat 36° 00 South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 30th Sept

First part of these 24 hours rather more moderate saw plenty bright whales at 3 P.M. lowered for whales but could not strike middle parts calm finished boiling at daylight made sail with light winds and Hazy saw whale lowered but could not strike 3 sail in sight chasing whales

Long 152° 43 East Lat 36° 11 South

Remarks On Board 1st October

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S.E. & under single reef top sails chasing whales but could not strike at sundown took in sail heading to the S. plenty whales in sight and 3 sail all whaling middle and latter parts light winds from the S. and Hazy at daylight made sail saw whales and chased

Long 152° 35 East Lat 36° 11 S

Remarks On Board 2nd Oct

First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the S. and Hazy chasing whales saw a Bk. whaling at sundown took in sail to the East middle parts wind hauled to the S.W. at daylight doubled the top sails commenced stowing down main hatch wind S.W. steering to the East saw no whales

Long 152° 57 East Lat 36° 11 S

Remarks On Board Friday 3rd Oct

First part strong breeze from the S.W. finished stowing down 55th Whale Oil spoke the brig Marion at sundown took in sail to the East middle parts fresh gales latter moderate all sail set course at 10 no whales in sight

Long 153° 19 East Lat 35° 53 S

On East Coast New Holland. Bright Whaling.

Remarks On Board Saturday 4th October 1845

First part of these 24 hours calm employed at scraping Bone at sundown took in sail light air from the S.E. heading to the S.W. middle parts wind doubled at daylight made sail with fresh breezes at 4 saw whales lowered but could not strike

Long 152° 20 East Lat 35° 56 South

Remarks On Board Sunday 5th Oct

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the S.W. chasing whale 3 sail in sight but none got long at sundown took in sail middle parts light air latter parts calm at 7 a.m. lowered 2 whales struck to the West Boat and lowered still after whales

Long 151° 41 East Lat 35° 52 South

Remarks On Board Monday 6th Oct

First part of these 24 hours light air from the S.W. plenty whales and wind North of but could not strike 1 sail in sight at sundown came on board and took in sail middle parts fine latter parts fresh breezes from the North all sail set saw whales lowered and struck West Boat 2 lions and the Starboard with 2 more Irons all lowered the whale went off plenty whales but could not strike again

Long 151° 41 East Lat 35° 52 S

Remarks On Board Tuesday 7th Oct

First part of these 24 hours after whales but could not strike 4 sail in sight after whales without success at sundown took in sail the Coast in sight 40 miles off middle parts wind hauled to the South at daylight strong breezes set double reef top sails heading to the East at 11 a.m. a sail took in 2nd the top sails 2 sail in sight

Long 151° 16 East Lat 35° 50 South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 8th Oct

First part a gale from the South under close reef main top sail and spencer to the East 1 Bk. 1/2 Bk. in sight middle parts heavy sea latter parts moderate steering to the West the land in sight made sail saw 2 sail inshore whaling at 12 midnight saw a whale land 20 miles off

Long 150° 41 East Lat 35° 44 South

Remarks On Board Thursday 9th Oct

First part of these 24 hours plenty whales lowered but could not strike saw 1 bright whale the others got none at sundown doubled the reef top sails heading to the East the land 5 leagues distant middle parts light air from the S.W. at daylight made all sail land 4 leagues distant saw no whales but saw a Bk. take a whale

Long 150° 48 East Lat 35° 33 South

Remarks On Board Friday 10th Oct

First part of this day all sail set again breeze from the S.E. & laying to the East at sundown doubled the reef top sails heading to the S.W. saw backs middle parts took in 1 main & main top sails wind hauled to the South with rain latter parts strong winds from the S.E. made all sail saw 3 sail 1 Bk. boiling

Long 151° 15 East Lat 35° 39 South

Remarks On Board Saturday 11th Oct

First part fresh winds from the S.E. took in M.S. sail very overcast at sundown doubled the reef top sails by the wind to the S.W. middle and latter parts fresh winds and rain at daylight made all sail steering by the wind to the S.E. saw nothing remarkable

to Oct this day by the 35° 20'
