 Remarks On Board *Thursday 4th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours light air from the S.W. and hazy at 4 P.M. wind changes to the S.E. saw 1 blackfish however and got one at sundown took in sail heading to the Eastward Middle strong breezes latter part 1 sail in sight saw 1 blackfish
 Long 160° 01' East Lat by Obs 35° 19' S
 Remarks On Board *Friday 5th Decr*
 First part of this day Double Reefed the top sails strong winds from the S.W. saw 1 blackfish at sundown took in sail 7.5. When heading to the S.W. Middle parts moderate latter parts nearly calm saw 1 blackfish
 Long 160° 01' East Lat by Obs 35° 24' S
 Remarks On Board *Saturday 6th Decr*
 First part calm at sundown Double Reefed top sails light air from the North course to S.W. Middle parts light winds latter parts all sail set at the S.W. to fresh breezes from the S.W.
 Long 158° 40' East Lat by Obs 35° 47' South
 Remarks On Board *Sunday 7th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the North all sail set course S.W. at sundown took in sail heading to the Eastward Middle parts moderate latter all sail set wind S.W. and hazy by the wind S.E.
 Long 159° 30' East Lat by Obs 36° 08' South
 Remarks On Board *Monday 8th Decr*
 First part moderate wind from S.W. and hazy heading to the S.E. saw 1 blackfish at sundown took in sail Middle parts more to the S.E. at daylight made all sail and tacked ship to the West fine weather
 Long 159° 12' East Lat by Obs 35° 50' South
 Remarks On Board *Tuesday 9th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the North took in top sail and main sail at sundown took in sail heading to the S.W. Middle parts more ship to the S.E. latter parts thick hazy weather under short sail
 Remarks On Board *Wednesday 10th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours heading to the S.W. under short sail thick and rainy wind S.W. at sundown took in sail to the S.E. Middle parts wind changes to the S. latter parts fine made sail of the ship Charles W. Morgan Capt Sampson 6 months out when
 Long 158° 54' E Lat by Obs 36° 06' S
 Remarks On Board *Thursday 11th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours fine weather wind S.E. steering S.W. in company with the C.M. at sundown took in sail heading to the East Middle parts fine latter parts all sail set heading to the S.W.

 Remarks On Board *Friday 12th Decr*
 First part of this day fine breezes from the S.E. in company with the C.M. at sundown took in sail heading to the South latter parts fine all sail set tacked ship to the South

 First part of these 24 hours fine weather moderate winds from the S.E. all sail set heading to the S.W. at sundown took in sail more ship to the S.E. Middle parts more ship to the S.W. latter parts fine weather all sail set 2 sail in sight
 Long 159° 13' E Lat by Obs 35° 21' South
 Remarks On Board *14th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours light air from the S.E. all sail set heading S.W. however and got a blackfish at sundown took in sail Middle parts fine latter parts fresh breezes from the S.W. all sail set 2 sail of which 1 blackfish was taken 16 months out when
 Long 158° 47' E Lat by Obs 34° 56' S
 Remarks On Board *15th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours fine weather fresh winds from the S.E. at sundown took in sail heading to the Eastward Middle parts under Double Reef latter parts strong breezes from the S.E. under top sails and 1 blackfish taken East
 Long 160° 45' East Lat by Obs 34° 30' S
 Remarks On Board *16th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S.E. to S heading to the East at sundown took in main sail and Double Reef the top sails the S.W. Morgan in sight Middle parts heading S.E. latter parts S.W. strong breezes wind S.W.
 Long 162° 14' East Lat by Obs 34° 57' S
 Remarks On Board *17th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S.W. heading on the wind to the S.W. under Double Reef top sails under main top sail at sundown took in sail Middle no alterations latter part moderate made all sail more ship to the S.W.
 Long 162° 46' East Lat by Obs 35° 27' S
 Remarks On Board *18th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours light winds from the S.E. heading to the S.W. at sundown took in sail Middle and latter parts light winds and calm
 Long 163° 15' East Lat by Obs 35° 27' S
 Remarks On Board *19th Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours calm bent our old main top sail at sundown took in sail light air from the East course S.W. by the Middle parts fine latter parts light winds from the S.W. all sail set steering S.W. by W at 9 saw a flock of 4 sperm whales however and struck 1 to each boat but parted the line to the waste boat and lost him
 Long by Obs 161° 30' East Lat by Obs 35° 46' S
 Remarks On Board *20th Decr*
 First part fine weather took our 2 whales long side at 3 P.M. began to cut at sundown got one in case and put the Middle parts and long side away and killing the case at daylight fine at 6 A.M. commenced cutting our whale latter fine light winds from the S.W. made sail heading to the West
 Long 161° 00' East Lat by Obs 36° 00' S
 Remarks On Board *21st Decr*
 First part of these 24 hours fine weather killed the case and commenced killing at sundown kept the top sails heading West W Middle and latter parts fine pleasant weather killing more ship to the North saw 1 blackfish
 Long 160° 26' East Lat by Obs 36° 10' S
