Remarks On Board Monday 22nd December 1845
Drove part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the West heading on the shoreward tack Boiling at sundown took in sail passed a three masted Schooner Middle and latter parts strong wind from the S.W. and rigged Boiling

Long 160° 06 East Lat by Obs 34° 58 South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 23rd Dec

First part of these 24 hours more moderate under South Reefed Top Sails heading West Boiling Middle parts were ship to the South latter parts all sail set to the S.W. wind S.W. wind 2 sail of which Boiling and worked off

Long 159° 59 East Lat 35° 05 South

Remarks On Board Wednesday 24th Dec

First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all sail set heading S.W. at 6 P.M. raised a fog of smoke going quick to the deck & down at sundown came up with one but could not strike same on board and took in sail at daylight made all sail heading to the West wind S.W. broke out clear side after watch for showing oil cloudy weather

Remarks On Board Thursday 25th Dec

First part of these 24 hours thick misty weather slowed down 46 lbs sperm oil wind hauled to the S.W. with rain took in sail and finished stowing for the day at 4 P.M. wind from the S.E. and rigged heading to the S.W. Middle parts wind hauled to the S.W. were ship to the S.E. at daylight made sail and began stowing down 12 sail in sight

Long 159° 35 East Lat by Obs 35° 38 South

Remarks On Board Friday 26th Dec

First part of these 24 hours finished stowing down 67 lbs of sperm at sundown light air from the S.W. took in sail Middle parts light air latter parts all sail set, 3 sail in sight

Long 159° 06 East Lat by Obs 35° 31 S

Remarks On Board Saturday 27th Dec

First part of these 24 hours fine weather moderate breezes from the E & E heading to the North at sundown took in sail heading to the S.E. 2 lbs in sight Middle parts fine latter parts thick Hazy weather wind from the E & W heading to the West

Long 158° 57 East Lat by Obs 35° 25 S

Remarks On Board Sunday 28th Dec

First part of these 24 hours thick weather at 4 spoke 2 Packet came on rain took in sail heading to the E & at sundown cleared up strong breezes from the S.W. Middle parts light winds latter parts small sail set steering to the Eastward

Long 160° 11 East Lat by Obs 35° 18 S

Remarks On Board Monday 29th Dec

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the South all sail set heading to the East & sail in sight at sundown light air from the S.E. took in sail heading to the S.W. Middle and latter parts thick Hazy weather 3 sail in sight

Long Lat by Obs 35° 24 S

Remarks On Board Tuesday 30th Dec

First part of these 24 hours thick Hazy weather fresh breezes from the South at sundown took in sail spoke 136 Hogsheads of Mackerel 15 months out 500 lbs sperm Middle parts thick Hazy weather wind changed to the South latter parts thick under Double Reefed Top Sails drove ship to the East 136 & Boiling in sight

Remarks On Board Wednesday 31st Dec 1845

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the S.E. heading to the E & E under Reefed Top Sails heavy weather at sundown took in sail and were ship to the S.W. Middle parts same latter parts light winds all sail set

Long 160° 11 East Lat by Obs 35° 14 South

Remarks On Board Thursday 1st January 1846

First part of this day light air from the S.W. and calm at sundown took in sail heading to the S.W. Middle parts fine latter no alteration all sail set saw the Hoop, steering to the East

Long 159° 01 East Lat by Obs 35° 47 S

Remarks On Board Friday 2nd Jan

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the S.W. and all sail set heading to the West at sundown took in sail Middle strong breezes from the South latter parts under Double Reefed Top Sails and Rigged weather

Long 158° 14 East Lat by Obs 36° 13 S

Remarks On Board Saturday 3rd Jan

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the North under Double Reefed Top Sails heading to the West at sundown took in sail and were ship to the S.E. Middle parts cloud and thick latter parts a squall from the S.W. with thunder and lightning and rain wind hauled again to the North set Double Reefed Top Sails

Long 159° 24 East Lat by Obs 36° 33 S

Remarks On Board Sunday 4th Jan

First part of these 24 hours mild breeze from the North under Double Reef at sundown got to the S.W. and South heading to the S.E. took in sail saw Blackfish Middle and latter parts strong breezes and squally at daylight made sail Double Reef Course E & W

Long 159° 22 East Lat by Obs 36° 47 S

Remarks On Board Monday 5th Jan

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from the South and rugged under Double Reef steering to the S.W. at sundown took in sail were ship to the East Reel a heavy squall passed took up to the fore sail and split up and went to the back furler it Middle parts fine latter part made sail and bent a fore sail took the other down to repair

Long 159° 32 East Lat by Obs 34° 55 South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 6th Jan

First part of these 24 hours fine weather heading to the East wind S by E repairing fore sail at sundown reefed the Top Sails Middle parts fine latter parts all sail set employed on the fore sail

Long by Loran 159° 15 E by Obs 159° 34 E Lat by Obs 35° 04 S

Remarks On Board Wednesday 7th Jan

First part of these 24 hours fine weather light winds from the South all sail set finished the fore sail and built it at sundown took in sail heading to the Westward Middle parts fine latter parts light air and calm at 10 A.M. saw Blackfish lowered and got 5

Long 159° 08 East Lat by Obs 35° 06 South

Remarks On Board Thursday 8th Jan

First part of these 24 hours calm chased away our Mackerel and minced it at sundown took in sail heading to the S.W. light air from the S.W. Middle parts same steering to the South latter parts fine breezes from the East all sail set heading to the South
