Some part of these 24 hours fine weather light breeze from the S by S all sail set heading to the South at Sundown took in Sail Middle parts fine at daylight made all sail heading to the S by S saw a Rip Boiling spoke in the Christy in Mitchell of Charleston 5 1/2 months out 4000 lbs. fine had cut a whole in the hull alongside.

Some part of these 24 hours fine breeze from the S by S all sail set heading to the S by S saw plenty pumps at 4 1/2 M saw a beach supposed to be a storm whale saw nothing more at Sundown took in Sail Middle Parts North Sea Blackfish Middle parts strong breeze from the S by S latter parts rising wind headed to the South under Double Reefed Top Sails to the East

Remarks On Board Sunday 11th Jan

Some part of this day strong breeze from the South wind ruffled under Double Reefed Top Sails to the East at 4 P M took in 3rd Mizzen Top Sails Obsd Ship the Main Middle parts breeze from the S by S latter parts same under short sail at the S by S

Remarks On Board Monday 12th Jan

Some part of these 24 hours fresh wind from the S by S and ruffled at the 1st Mizzen Top Sails steering to the S by S at Sundown took in Sail heading to the S by S Middle moderate latter parts under Double Reef steering S by S

Remarks On Board Tuesday 13th Jan

First part of these 24 hours fine made all sail heading to the S by S wind East at 5 P M spoke the Hoogley had seen nothing at Sundown took in Sail Middle and latter parts fine weather heading to the S by S and S by S all sail set

Remarks On Board Wednesday 14th Jan

First part of these 24 hours fine moderate breeze from the S by S all sail set heading to the S by S at Sundown took in Sail Middle and latter parts cloudy with fresh breeze from the S by S heading to the Eastward

Remarks On Board Thursday 15th Jan

Some part of this day moderate breeze from the S by S and Hazy heading to the East at Sundown took in Sail Middle and latter parts strong wind under Top Sails under Ship to the S by S

Remarks On Board Friday 16th Jan

Some part of this day strong wind from the S by S and thick weather Double Reefed the Top Sails took in the 1st Mizzen Top Sails and closed Reel the main it being rainy heading S by S Middle parts a Gale from the East latter parts headed to the South with rain took in the 1st Mizzen Top Sails heading to the East

Some part of these 24 hours a Gale from the South heading to the East under Closed Reefed Main Top Sails Middle moderate at daylight fine breeze from the S by S made all sail course S by S

Some part of these 24 hours Moderate breeze from the West Course S by South at Sundown took in Sail Middle parts Course S by S latter fine all sail set on our course saw Porpoises

Some part of these 24 hours All sail set wind South to S by S Course S by S at Sundown Double Reefed the Top Sails Middle and latter part wind from the West to S by S employed at repairing the Main Sail

Remarks On Board Tuesday 19th Jan

Some part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the S by S and Smoky Course S by S employed on the Main Sail at Sundown took in Sail Middle and latter parts no alteration in the wind or weather finished Main Sail and bent it

Remarks On Board Wednesday 20th Jan

Some part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the S by S and heavy under Double Reef Course S by S at Sundown wind changed to the S by S took in Sail heading to the South Middle parts wind from the S by S at 10 P M a heavy Gale took in the 1st Mizzen Top Sails under Close Reefed Main Top Sails at daylight Moderate set Double Reefed Top Sails Course S by S at 9 A M set whole Top Sails

Remarks On Board Thursday 21st Jan

Some part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the S by S and Course S by S saw a BH laying too Close Reel Main Top Sails at Sundown took in Sail heading to the S by S Middle and latter parts a Gale from the West

Remarks On Board Friday 22nd Jan

First part of these 24 hours Moderate spoke Ship Henry of Sag Harbor 2 Whales Course S by S under Short Sail at Sundown suffered too to the S by S Middle and latter fresh winds and ruffled latter parts steering S by S saw Finbacks

Remarks On Board Saturday 23rd Jan

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the S by S Course S by S at 3 P M saw the Three Kings distant 7 leagues at Sundown spoke London Packet 3000 lbs. fine wind South heading to the Westward Middle and latter parts fine weather at daylight made all sail 3 sail in sight

Lat by Obs 34° 02' S

Remarks On Board Sunday 24th Jan

First part of these 24 hours fine weather light wind from the S by S at Sundown Double Reefed the Top Sails heading to the S by S the Kings bearing S by S distant 6 leagues Middle parts heading off shore latter fine weather all sail set saw plenty Finbacks and Porpoises (the Kings in sight)

Lat by Obs 33° 46' S

Remarks On Board Monday 25th Jan

First part of these 24 hours light breeze from the S by S heading inshore at Sundown took in Sail 6 sail in sight the Kings bearing S by S distant 7 leagues Middle parts fine latter parts 5 sail in sight which weather and squally all sail set the Kings in sight (lost our other 2 sails)

No Obs this day
