Remarks On Board Tuesday 7th April 1846  
Fore part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the S.W. by W. under  
Sail leading to the S.W. Boasting out after Hatchway at sundown took in Sail more  
Ship to the South Minster and latter strong Gale under Double Reefed Top Sails  
Long 176° 30 East Lat 32° 36 South



Remarks On Board Wednesday 8th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours strong Gale from the S.W. and  
suggled at sundown took in Sail leading to the S.E. Minster and latter part strong winds  
and suggled at daylight set double Reefed Top Sails saw Whales lowered and struck to the  
Starboard Boat at 11 A.M. took him alongside  
Long by Acc 176° 40 E Lat 32° 22 S

Remarks On Board Thursday 9th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S.W. and  
very suggest commenced cutting and broke a Hook cut the Head square off and  
took in the Body and lay by the Head at sundown shaved up and commenced Boiling  
the Body Middle part fresh Breeze and a heavy sea the latter part taking in the Head  
Long 176° 20 E Lat 32° 06 South

Remarks On Board Friday 10th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours Moderate Breeze got the Head  
in camp lay at Boiling Middle part light breeze latter part same all Sail set steering to the  
South Boiling  
Long 176° 20 E Lat 32° 06 South

Remarks On Board Saturday 11th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather light winds from  
West the Sail set steering to the South finished Boiling and washed off at sundown took  
in Sail Middle part light winds from the West the latter part same all Sail set  
Long 176° 49 East Lat 32° 19 S

Remarks On Board Sunday 12th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours fresh Breeze from the S.W.  
all Sail set leading to the S.W. at sundown took in Sail Middle part fine latter same  
made all Sail steering to the South  
Long 176° 39 East Lat 32° 40 South

Remarks On Board Monday 13th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather wind at S.W.  
all Sail set leading to the S.W. at sundown took in Sail Middle part fine breeze at 9 P.M.  
saw Whales at daylight made Sail Double Reefed Top Sails commenced Steaming down  
Fore Hatchway  
Long by Acc 176° 30 East Lat 32° 36 South



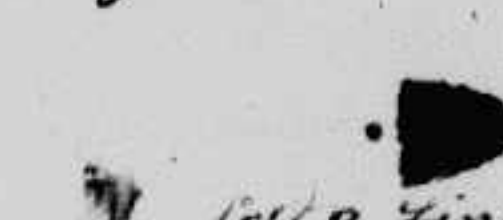
Remarks On Board Tuesday 14th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours Moderate Steaming down at 1 P.  
M saw Whales lowered and struck to the Starboard Boat and parted the line  
came on Board and finished Steaming down at sundown took in Sail leading  
to the South Middle part fine latter same light Breeze from the S.W. saw  
Whales lowered and struck to the Starboard Boat and struck to the Starboard  
Boat and Draved killed the other, and the other 2 Boats chasing but could  
not strike again  
Long 176° 40 E Lat 32° 49 S

On The Coast New Zealand

Remarks On Board Wednesday 15th April 1846  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather light winds  
from the S.W. took our whale alongside at 3 began to cut at dusk finished Middle  
part shaving away and cutting junk at daylight began to Boil latter part fine weather  
leading to the West Boiling  
Long 176° 00 East Lat 32° 30 South



Remarks On Board Thursday 16th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather leading to the  
West wind S.W. Boiling saw Whales lowered but could not strike came on Board  
and took in Sail Middle part fine Boiling latter part same all Sail saw Whales lowered  
and struck to the Starboard Boat and took him alongside washed down and got ready  
for cutting  
Long 175° 47 Lat 32° 15 S



Remarks On Board Friday 17th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine continued cutting  
at sundown finished and took in Sail fine S.W. and light Middle part Boiling  
latter part light air and calm saw Whales lowered and struck to the Starboard Boat  
a large whale and lost a line chased him but could not come up with him  
Long 175° 50 E Lat 31° 55 S

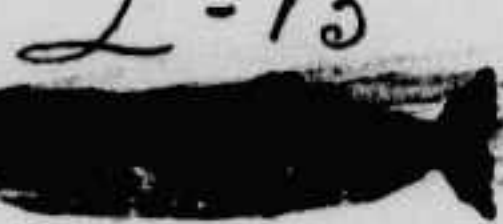
Remarks On Board Saturday 18th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours calm Boiling and Steaming  
the Whales without success came on Board at sundown took in Sail Middle part  
light air latter part same Boiling and Steaming down  
Long by Acc 175° 50 E Lat 32° 00 S



Remarks On Board Sunday 19th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours fresh Breeze from the S.W.  
finished Boiling at 4 P.M. saw a large whale going quick to the S.W. no chance for  
him at sundown took in Sail Middle and latter part fine pleasant weather all  
Sail set leading to the S.W. wind S.W.  
Long 175° 14 E Lat 31° 55 S



Remarks On Board Monday 20th April  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather all Sail set  
leading to the S.W. at 4 P.M. saw Whales lowered and struck to the Starboard  
Boat got the waste Boat stove and lost her and line at dusk took our whale  
alongside and took in Sail Middle part fine at daylight commenced cutting at noon  
finished fine weather fine North  
Long 175° 18 E Lat 32° 05 S



Remarks On Board Tuesday 21st April  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather wind at S.W.  
employed at Boiling and Steaming down Fore Hatchway Middle part fine Boiling  
latter part same made all Sail saw Whales lowered and struck to the Starboard  
Boat  
Long 175° 50 East Lat 32° 10 S

Remarks On Board Wednesday 22nd April  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine light winds from the  
North at 4 took our whale alongside and took in Sail employed at Boiling Middle and latter  
part fine weather cut in our whale light winds from the North  
Long 175° 20 Lat 32° 24 S
