shocks Middle and latter parts fine

Remarks On Board Monday 18<sup>th</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather Middle same  
latter parts took of a raft of water and started it

Remarks On Board Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine employed at ship duty  
(Middle parts rainy) with heavy shower and sharp lightning took off 4 bales of clothes

Remarks On Board Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine employed at ship  
duty Middle and latter parts rainy

Remarks On Board Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather employed at ship  
duty Middle and latter parts thick weather

Remarks On Board Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> May  
Fore part of this day fresh breezes from the North  
and rainy Middle parts strong gales from the N.W. swept round anchor latter parts same

Remarks On Board Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours strong winds from the  
West Middle parts moderate latter parts slighter our anchors and hauled off Discharged  
Thomas Adams, Thomas Brown, Jack Davy

Remarks On Board Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the  
West with a heavy squall Middle and latter parts strong breezes from the West

Remarks On Board Monday 25<sup>th</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours strong gales from the  
West Middle and latter same with rain got ready for sea Daniel Willson Deserted

Remarks On Board Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours squally with rain  
Middle parts same latter parts took our starboard anchor and hauled out

Remarks On Board Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> May  
Fore part fresh breezes from the West Middle parts light  
air at daylight Made sail and took our anchor and stood out light winds from the South  
Shipped William Evans, Charles Bowen, William Elliott and William Horton and  
John Russell finished stowing the anchors and clearing the decks  
Long by Oct 174<sup>o</sup> 4 E Nine Pin Bearing West Distant 1 mile

Fore part of these 24 hours fine wind South Course only 8  
at sundown Cape Horn Bore 8 E & Distance 3 leagues South Islands Bore 26 & 20 distant  
6 leagues Middle and latter parts light winds from the South  
Long 176<sup>o</sup> 00 E Lat 34<sup>o</sup> 12 S

Remarks On Board Friday 29<sup>th</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours light winds from the South  
Course at by E & East at sundown repair the Top Sails Middle part light airs latter part  
fresh breezes from the North heading to the Eastward  
Long 176<sup>o</sup> 23 East Lat 33<sup>o</sup> 52 S

Remarks On Board Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the North  
heading to the East at sundown took in sail some 900 to the West Middle parts took  
in Bore & Mizzen Top Sails latter a gale from the North closed Reefed the main Top Sail  
and took up our Boat  
Long 176<sup>o</sup> 14 East Lat 33<sup>o</sup> 26 S

Remarks On Board Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> May  
Fore part of these 24 hours a gale from the North  
fore under closed Reefed main Top Sail and fore sail heading to the East Middle  
parts moderate latter parts set Double Reefed Top Sails  
Long 177<sup>o</sup> 20 East Lat 33<sup>o</sup> 48 S

Remarks On Board Monday 1<sup>st</sup> June  
Fore part of these 24 hours strong winds from the  
North under Double Reefed Top Sails heading to the East at sundown took in fore  
and spanker Middle and latter parts quite moderate Made all sail at daylight wine  
Ship to the N.W.  
Long 177<sup>o</sup> 20 East Lat 33<sup>o</sup> 44 S

Remarks On Board Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> June  
Fore part of these 24 hours strong gales from the North  
Double Reefed the Top Sails carrying sail to get to the N.W. heading at 20 Middle and  
latter parts same heading on edge track cloudy weather  
Long by Oct 177<sup>o</sup> 20 E Lat 33<sup>o</sup> 20 S

Remarks On Board Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> June  
Fore part of these 24 hours light winds from the North  
and thick weather at 4 P.M. saw Whales a squall of rain came saw them again but to  
late did not lower took in sail wind hauled off the 9 P.M. heading to the West  
Middle parts fine with a heavy swell at daylight Made all sail saw 2 whales foreward  
and struck to the starboard Boat with second Iron and parted shot masts latter parts  
Calm  
Long 177<sup>o</sup> 11 East Lat 32<sup>o</sup> 48 S

Remarks On Board Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> June  
Fore part of these 24 hours calm took up our Boat  
at sundown took in sail closed Reefed main Top Sail Middle parts light winds  
from the E & E steering at 20 at daylight Made sail at 8 A.M. saw Whales  
lowered and struck to the starboard Boat and took him alongside at 12  
A.M. in a squall fresh breezes from the East  
Long by Oct 177<sup>o</sup> 04 E Lat 32<sup>o</sup> 20 S
