Remarks On Board Friday 10<sup>th</sup> July 1846

Some part of these 24 hours fine weather fresh Trades all sail set Course S by W Middle part of Moderate Breezes Course S by W latter parts the same unbest the main top of S sail and stayed in some cloth

Remarks On Board Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather light breeze from the ESE all sail set Course S by W finished in 39 sail and bent it Middle parts wind from the SE latter parts from the North

Remarks On Board Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours fine Breezes from the SSW all sail set at 4 P.M. hauld to the W heading S by W could not lay on Course S by W Middle parts repair the top sail latter parts fresh Breezes all sail set at 11 A.M. saw Hunter Island bearing S by W distant 4 leagues

Remarks On Board Monday 13<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours fresh Breezes from the SSE at sundown Hunter Island Bore E by E for Compass and Matthews Island Bore S by W Middle and latter parts light Breezes from the South heading W by S employed in repairing main sail

Remarks On Board Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours light wind from the South heading to the West all sail set Middle parts tacked Ship to the SE latter parts fresh Breezes from the S by W Matthews Island in sight finished the main sail and bent it

Remarks On Board Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of the 24 hours fresh Breezes from the South took in main top of S sail at sundown single Reef of the top sails Matthews Island Bore E by E distant 4 leagues Middle parts fresh Breezes heading W by W with a Rain squall from the South latter parts going S by W spoke 156 Isabella corner of Sydney steering to the SE

Remarks On Board Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours fresh wind from the S by E all sail set by the wind to the S by W beyond a Capricorn setting to the SE set employed in repairing top of sail Middle and latter parts fine Breezes from the SE course S by W all sail set

Remarks On Board Friday 17<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours fine weather with light Breezes from the SE course S by W finished the top of S sail and bent it employed about the Riggin Middle and latter parts light wind and calm setting up Riggin and reeving down

Bound On The Coast New Holland

Remarks On Board Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> July 1846

Some part of these 24 hours light wind from the SE all sail set Course S by W at sundown Double Reef of the top sails Middle parts fresh Breezes at daylight saw a shoal of Whales lowered and struck to the Starboard Boat and got stove it being very rugged and squally lost the Boat and Craft and with the lower and picked up the craft went on Board made all sail to be set up to the Boat the whales in sight

Remarks On Board Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours the whales in sight lowered but could not come up with them saw nothing of the Boat at sundown took in sail Middle and latter parts strong breezes from the ESE and rugged steering to the SE under Double Reef of top sail saw Orinbacks

Long 166° 31 East

Remarks On Board Monday 20<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours strong wind from the ESE under reef of top sails at sundown wore Ship to the S Middle parts took in 2<sup>nd</sup> Mizzen top sail at daylight made sail Course W by S strong breezes employed about the riggin saw plenty of Orinbacks

Remarks On Board Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours strong wind from the ESE Course W by S at sundown Double Reef of the top sails Middle and latter parts fine at daylight made all sail Course S by W employed at breaking out and starting water

Remarks On Board Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours squally at sundown took in sail heading to the S by W Middle parts by the same latter made sail fresh Breezes Course W by S repairing Mizzen top sail

Remarks On Board Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the ESE Course W by S at 4 P.M. saw a shoal of Whales lowered the Boat and struck to the Starboard & Starboard Boat at 4 took them alongside and took in sail Middle parts muzz got ready for cutting at daylight commenced cutting at 11 A.M. finished all (Wude sail to the SE wind 18 kts E

Remarks On Board Friday 24<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours fine weather clear away the Heads and set the works going Middle and latter parts Boiling stung the the Westward saw Orinbacks

Remarks On Board Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> July

Some part of these 24 hours fresh Breezes from the SE steering W by W Boiling at sundown took in sail heading to the ESE Middle parts finished Boiling latter parts squally and rainy washed off and hoisted up under Short sail heading to the westward
