Remarks On Board Monday 2^d November 1846

Fore part of these 24 hours fair weather but in the third
whale and took in the junkies based at sundown went Ship to the South wind & S.E.
Middle parts showed under the bases saw and cut the junkies at daylight commenced Boiling
latter parts all sail set heading to the South saw the Canton Packet chasing whale to windward
Long 155° 03' E Lat 31° 36' South

Remarks On Board Tuesday 3^d Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours Boiling saw the Canton Packet chasing
whales taken Ship and found her boats chasing to windward at 5 P.M. however from the whales
to windward but could not overtake them at sundown came on Board and took in
sail Middle parts Boiling at daylight made sail at 9 A.M. saw the Canton Packet's Boat
fasten to a whale the Seal took to windward
Long 154° 43' East Lat 29° 07' S

Remarks On Board Wednesday 4th Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours the whales in sight 4 miles off lowered
the Boats but could not overtake them they going to the South quick came on Board at sundown
and Double Reefed the Top Sails heading to the South wind S.E. to S.W. Middle parts fine Boiling
latter parts Boiling all sail set at 4 saw sperm whales at 11 A.M. lowered and struck to the
Starboard Boat came on Board and struck for the whale
Long 154° 15' East Lat 29° 36' S

Remarks On Board Thursday 5th Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours took the whale alongside
at 2 P.M. commenced cutting at 6 finished and took in sail Middle parts fine winds
from S.E. heading to the N.E. at daylight made sail and saw whales lowered and
struck to the Starboard Boat and Starboard Boats 2 whales saved and cut to the
Starboard Boat took our whale alongside and cut him in the C.P. in sight
Long 154° 20' E Lat 30° 44' S

Remarks On Board Friday 6th Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours Boiling fine breezes from
the East heading to the North at sundown took in sail Middle parts Boiling latter parts
all sail set heading to the North Boiling strong current to the South
Long 154° 34' East Lat 31° 01' S

Remarks On Board Saturday 7th Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours fine weather wind E.N.E.
heading to the North Boiling at sundown spoke the E. Packet Boiling Middle
parts Boiling latter parts fresh breeze from the N.E. & finished Boiling
stowed down and coopersing
Long 154° 31' East Lat 31° 37' S

Remarks On Board Sunday 8th Nov

Fore part fresh breezes from the N.E. & W. heading
to the N.E. by 1 P.M. coopersing and stowing up at sundown took in sail
Middle parts strong winds latter parts calm but South Reef Top Sails heading
to the S.E.
Long 155° 02' E Lat 32° 02' S

Remarks On Board Monday 9th November 1846

Fore part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the N.E. & W.
heading to the West under Double Reef Top Sails saw Humpbacks Middle parts fine latter
parts coopersing and stowing down Bottom Sails left at 7 A.M. saw a sperm whale
lowered and struck to the Waste Boat at 12 Munday took him alongside
Long 155° 37' East Lat 31° 28' S

Remarks On Board Tuesday 10th Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours commenced cutting and took in
look at 4 got the Body in land day by the head Middle parts strong S.W.
winds heading to the West and very ragged latter parts same in wearing Ship to take in
the head parted the Case chain and lost the Head, sunk rest part stowing down
after Hatchway
Long 155° 40' East Lat 31° 14' S

Remarks On Board Wednesday 11th Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours strong winds from N.E. & W.
heading N.E. stowing down and Boiling the Body at sundown went Ship to
the N.W. a strong current setting to the N.E. & Middle parts Boiling latter parts light
air Boiling & stowing after Hatchway
Long 155° 37' East Lat 30° 54' S

Remarks On Board Thursday 12th Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours fine light airs from the
North Boiling & stowing the WH in sight Middle parts finished Boiling latter parts
strong breezes from the North 2 1/2 in sight employed in stowing down Broad Fore Hatch
way
Long 155° 47' East Lat 30° 55' S

Remarks On Board Friday 13th Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours strong winds from the North
heading to the N.E. & W. and coopersing & stowing out at sundown Double Reefed the
Top Sails Middle parts strong winds from the North stowing down
Long 155° 10' East Lat 30° 41' S

Remarks On Board Saturday 14th Nov

Fore part of these 24 hours strong winds from the North
at sundown finished stowing down and came the decks heading to the N.E. & W. Middle parts
same took in fore & main Top Sails latter parts went Ship to the East and set them
Long 154° 49' East Lat 30° 59' S

Remarks On Board Sunday 15th Nov

Fore part of this day strong North winds under Double Reef
heading to the N.E. & W. Middle parts the N.E. & W. the latter parts set main sail on 1/2
Long 154° 55' East Lat 31° 08' S

Remarks On Board Monday 16th Nov

Fore part strong winds from the North and ragged heading
to the N.E. & W. at sundown went Ship to the N.E. & W. took in main sail Middle and latter parts
strong breezes heading to the N.E. & W.
Long 153° 41' East Lat 31° 16' S
