Remarks On Board Friday 4<sup>th</sup> December 1846

Strove part of these 24 hours strong winds from the North all sail set course S.W. at 5 P.M. the Land Distance 9 leagues Course South West by South same latter part Course S.W. wind from N.E. at 10 P.M. at

Remarks On Board Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the N.E. at 10 P.M. at sundown Fort Stephens bore N.E. at 10 Distance 4 leagues Middle part fresh wind from the S.W. leading to the S.E. latter leading to the West the Land in sight

Long 151° 43 E the Land 6 miles off Bowen Bay Lat 33° 28 S

Remarks On Board Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours light winds from the S.E. leading off & on at sundown Broken Bay Distance 4 miles Middle part rainy latter part calm and hazy the Land in sight

Remarks On Board Monday 7<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours from the S.E. steering in van Sydney Heads at 5 P.M. took a Dredge at 6 canisters in Watsons Bay in 8 fathoms water and fished the Dredge Middle part fine latter part same took out our Starboard Pump and sent it up to Sydney

Remarks On Board Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours fine weather Middle and latter part fine setting up Haggie

Remarks On Board Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours fine weather took of some potatoes Middle and latter part fine Harrison Marsh and Bay Brooklyn Dredged

Remarks On Board Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours fine took off our new Pump Middle and latter part fine

Remarks On Board Friday 11<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours fine short for sea but could not get out Middle part fine latter part same fine Boreas from the N.E. at 9 A.M. took our anchor and beat out at 12 middle out past the Head

Remarks On Board Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours fresh Boreas from the N.E. all sail set leading S.E. shipped a man named William Wilson and the man found on Board as before stated by the name of John O'Garra Middle and latter part fresh Boreas from the N.E. found a stranger on Board by the name of Sanden

Remarks On Board Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of this day fine wind N.E. by E leading to the East Middle and latter part same with light squalls of rain took in Main Top Gallant sail

Remarks On Board Monday 14<sup>th</sup> December 1846

Strove part of these 24 hours fresh Boreas from the N.E. leading to the Eastward under top sail and course Middle and latter part moderate with squalls of rain employed at various jobs

Remarks On Board Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours wind changed to the West course by E with fine weather Middle and latter part same all sail set

Long 154° 22 East

Remarks On Board Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours fine weather all sail set wind light from the S.W. 1 sail in sight about 6 by 10 at sundown saw a hump whale 3 miles off took in sail course S.E. Middle part light air and calm daylight made sail saw 11 whales going very quick to the stroke (forward) but could not strike 'em on Board fine Boreas from the N.E. 1 sail in sight

Remarks On Board Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours fresh Boreas from the North leading to the East saw a ship at sundown Dredge fished the top of the and more 10.1 to the N.E. at 10 Middle part fine latter part same took out our Starboard Pump and sent it up to Sydney

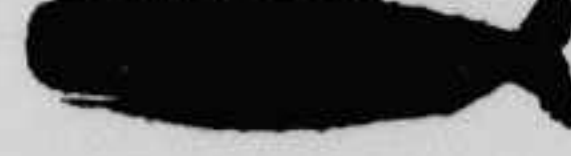
Remarks On Board Friday 18<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours wind N.E. all sail set leading to the East heavy weather at dusk saw 11 whales, took in sail Middle part fine at daylight made sail saw 11 whales (forward) but could not strike young quick came on Board made sail at 9 A.M. lowered again and struck to the Starboard the Waste Boats and took them alongside strong Boreas from the North and very rugged

Remarks On Board Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part of these 24 hours strong wind from the North and rugged commenced cutting at 7 got the body in long by the head and whale took in sail Middle strong wind and rugged at daylight took in the Head and shaved up and commenced cutting the other whale

Long by Oct 160° 30 E

Lat 36° 36 S

Remarks On Board Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> Dec

Strove part very rugged cut the Head square off and took in the Body at 6 P.M. parted from the Head took it alongside again took all part thick rain, weather Middle rain could not work latter part cleared up and commenced Boiling and hooked on to the Head

Long 160° 41 E

Remarks On Board Monday 21<sup>st</sup> Dec

Strove part Boiling took in the Head strong Gale from the S.W. and rugged at sundown shaved up Middle more moderate latter part fine weather Boiling leading to the West wind S.W. 1 sail in sight
