Remarks On Board Sunday 22nd Jan 1847
 Some part of these 24 hours thick strain under short sail, spoke
 the 1st all sail set in company with the Captain's Packet and spoke the brigs of
 New Bedford 14 months out, 2500 tons, 100 Whales Oil the Packet 2000 tons, 100
 Middle part fine - latter same (all sail set heading to the East 10 sail in sight
 Long 159° 13' E Lat 35° 57' S

Remarks On Board Monday 23rd Jan
 Some part of these 24 hours light wind from
 the 1st all sail set in company with the Captain's Packet and spoke the brigs of
 New Bedford 14 months out, 2500 tons, 100 Whales Oil the Packet 2000 tons, 100
 Middle part fine - latter same (all sail set heading to the East 10 sail in sight
 Long 159° 45' E Lat 36° 00' S

Remarks On Board Tuesday 24th Jan
 Some part of these 24 hours light wind from the 1st
 all sail set heading to the East at sundown took in sail Middle part fine weather
 latter wind changed to the South and rainy took in sail heading to the East
 Long 160° 00' E Lat 36° 00' S

Remarks On Board Wednesday 25th Jan
 Some part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the South
 and thick under short sail heading to the East at sundown took in sail Moderate none
 ship to the West 2 sail in sight Middle and latter strong breeze Made sail
 heading to the East 2 sail in sight
 Long 159° 46' East Lat 35° 36' S

Remarks On Board Thursday 26th Jan
 Some part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from
 the 1st heading to the East at sundown Double Reefed the Top Sails Middle
 and latter set fresh Breeze heading to the East 1 sail in sight
 Long 160° 11' Lat 35° 50' S

Remarks On Board Friday 27th Jan
 Some part of these 24 hours light breeze from the 1st
 taken ship to the East at sundown Double Reefed the Top Sails carrying sail for the
 East Middle part thick latter part clear off strong breeze
 Long 161° 30' E Lat 35° 20' S

Remarks On Board Saturday 28th Jan
 Some part of these 24 hours Moderate fresh
 the Reef out set Main Top & Sail heading East wind S E Middle part
 light winds all sail set heading to the East
 Long 160° 10' E Lat 35° 03' S

Remarks On Board Sunday 29th Jan
 Some part of these 24 hours light wind from the 1st & 2nd all sail
 set heading East Middle part same latter part S E fine weather
 Long 164° 35' E Lat 34° 57' S

Remarks On Board Monday 30th Jan
 Some part of these 24 hours light weather wind S E all
 sail set heading to the East Middle & latter part light winds and fine weather
 setting up rigging plenty of rope about here
 Long 166° 17' East Lat 34° 16' S

On Coast New Holland

Remarks On Board February 2nd 1847
 Some part of these 24 hours light wind from the 1st fine
 pleasant weather heading to the East setting up rigging at 4 PM saw whales lowered
 and chased but could not strike - much came on board and took in sail at
 daylight Made all sail heading to the East
 Long 167° 24' East Lat 34° 03' S

Remarks On Board Wednesday 3rd Feb
 Some part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the 1st & 2nd
 heading by the wind to the East at sundown Double Reefed Middle part
 same latter fresh breeze from the East Made all sail at 9 AM saw whales lowered
 and struck to the Larboard Boat and parted from him chased him and found
 him dead at 11 took him alongside and got ready for cutting
 Long 167° 50' East Lat 33° 31' S

Remarks On Board Thursday 4th Feb
 Some part of these 24 hours all day at 6 got all clear
 took in sail heading S E strong breeze Middle part Boiling latter part thick
 and rainy fresh gale could down and took in sail 11 PM in sight
 Long by Act 168° 30' E Lat 33° 59' S

Remarks On Board Friday 5th Feb
 Some part of these 24 hours a heavy gale from the
 1st under short reefed Main Top Sails and spencers heading to the East the 1st in
 sight Middle part same latter part a gale from the East 11 at 4 AM set the
 1st sail and left off East ran a few minutes and lost the West Boat and all
 the craft and crew Dory and spencers in a sea flock in fore sail and buff also
 to the South under short reefed Main Top Sails with a heavy sea running
 Long by Act 169° 00' Lat 34° 52' S

Remarks On Board Saturday 6th Feb
 Some part of these 24 hours running two under short reefed
 Main Top Sails and spencers heading to the East wind West and very heavy with a
 heavy sea found the ship to be 100 miles from lower Middle part same latter
 part Moderate some wind S E
 Long 169° 00' East Lat 34° 36' S

Remarks On Board Sunday 7th Feb
 Some part of these 24 hours light Moderate sail the
 1st sail course S E at 4 PM have two to the South and commenced Boiling at
 sundown quite Moderate Middle part light wind finished Boiling latter part thick
 and rainy light winds from the East heading to the East all sail set
 Long 170° 02' East Lat 34° 14' S

Remarks On Board Monday 8th Feb
 Some part of these 24 hours Moderate breeze from the East
 all sail set heading to the East at sundown took in sail 2 PM in sight Middle
 part fine latter part same all sail set employed in getting the West Boat
 out repairing sail and overhauling books
 Long 171° 05' E Lat 33° 29' S
