S.W. Middle and latter parts fresh Breezes under S. Sails & courses
Long 171° 22' East Lat 33° 00' S.

Remarks On Board Wednesday 2nd Feb
Gone part of these 24 hours fine weather wind S.E. heading
to the S.E. & saw Blackfish employed about the rigging and taking the plank off on the
Beamer and corking the stanchions at sundown Reel the S. Sails Middle and latter parts
fine weather all sail set saw a schooner employed in putting up a house off
Long 171° 33' East Lat 32° 58' S.

Remarks On Board Thursday 25th Feb
Gone part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all sail
set wind S.E. heading on the Eastern tack at sundown Reel the S. Sails Middle
and latter parts sails employed on the Rigging and various other jobs
Long 172° 42' E Lat 33° 20' S.

Remarks On Board Friday 26th Feb
Gone part of these 24 hours strong Breezes from the
S.E. by 10 by the wind to the East at sundown Reel the S. Sails took in
Main Sail and Jib Middle and latter parts fresh Breezes from the S.E. at
daylight made sail heading S.E. 3 Sails in sight spoke the Arabian of London 3 months
ago Long 174° 41' East Lat 34° 13' S.

Remarks On Board Saturday 27th Feb
Gone part of these 24 hours more moderate weather all sail
moderate Breezes from the S.E. heading on the Eastern tack at sundown Double
Reel the S. Sails and main ship to the S.W. Middle parts strong breezes latter
parts heading to the S.E. all sail set
Long 174° 51' East Lat 34° 50' S.

all sail set heading on the Western tack at sundown Calm Middle parts fresh
Breezes from the S.E. by heading to the S.W. at daylight saw Cape Horn
bearing S.W. by S distance 7 leagues
Long 175 Lat 35° 02' S.

again and changed ship

fitting rigging Middle parts fine latter parts same took of a raft of water and

Gone part of these 24 hours fine weather painting
Ship & corking Middle and latter parts fine painting ship

Gone part of these 24 hours fine weather painting and
fitting the Rudder Middle and latter parts fine Discharged Men Norton John Russell
to John Ryan

Remarks On Board Monday 8th March
Gone part of this day fine weather Middle parts
fine latter parts rainy took down our top works and got over spars down
before night

Remarks On Board Tuesday 9th March
Gone part of these 24 hours fine lashing our spars
and splitting water Middle and latter parts fine weather unbent some of our sails
and took in 2 tons potatoes

Remarks On Board Wednesday 10th March
Gone part of this day fine weather employed at various jobs
Middle and latter parts fresh Breezes building sails

Remarks On Board Thursday 11th March
Gone part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S.E.
building sails took off S. Sails Middle and latter parts rainy

Remarks On Board Friday 12th March
Gone part of these 24 hours rainy Middle and latter
parts same with strong breezes from S.E. set up the sheet anchor

Remarks On Board Saturday 13th March
Gone part of these 24 hours strong S.E. winds and
rainy Middle parts same latter parts changed off

Remarks On Board Sunday 14th March
Gone part of these 24 hours fine weather Bay & the
Main Sail and Main spruce and took of a raft of water Middle parts
fine latter same 2 Men Ship came on Board named Moses Stockton
at 4 o'clock under way light breezes from the South and stood out of
the Bay then took anchor and changed up the decks
