Monday
18 commenced with strong breeze from the southward steering
Latter 11⁴⁰ under badie sail In company with the
30¹⁸ shot the m Light Captain Crowl on board of
Long her saw the 8 tucks to the N & distant 20 miles
8²⁵ Middle part right winds from the southward
steering 11⁴⁰ In company with the general
Scott of fair haven fish recaptured 4 months
from home 100 barrels sperm lost at boat
and one man by a whale and had several
others hurt Latter part light winds from
the S & at 8 o'clock 2 o'clock hauled at back
for Captain Fisher to come on board our
mate went on board of his ship the 11⁴²

Thursday commenced with light winds from S & W
19 steering 11⁴⁰ by 11⁴⁰ In company
Latter with the general Scott Captain Fisher
28 00 on board here saw the North Light at
Long head distant 10 miles at 8 o'clock
8²⁵ Middle hauled at back for Captain Fisher
to go on board of his own ship Middle
part fine breeze from S & W course 11⁴⁰
by 11⁴⁰ under all sail Latter part fine breeze
from south saw a brig to the S & W steering
directly for us saw the general Scott and North
Light to the N & employed at mending
lower steering sail and mending the stern
about the cooper and carpenter stopped studding
11⁴ watch

Friday
20 commenced with fine breeze and pleasant went
Latter steering 11⁴⁰ by 11⁴⁰ under all sail employed at
25⁴⁰ mending up the fore royal mast and other ship
Long duty saw a finback and 3 sails the general Scott
8²⁵ and 11⁴⁰ Light to the N & and a brig to the
S & W coming up to us just at 6 o'clock at all
came at long side and hauled us she was the
Marian Gage of 11⁴⁰ 116 days out bound
to Santiago her longitude was 81.50 and
ours 9 82.25 37 miles difference
Middle part strong breeze from S & steering 11⁴⁰ by 11⁴⁰
under all sail Latter part the same employed
at mending on old fore royal saw a brig at
head and a sail to the southward
we have lost sight of our old company

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Monday
21 commenced with fine breeze from S & steering
Latter 11⁴⁰ by 11⁴⁰ under all sail saw a brig a head
27 employed at mending a fore royal and make
ing spungarn which is every days work in
3⁰² good weather when we are out whaling which
3³⁴ does not happen every day Middle part
Latter strong breeze steering 11⁴⁰ by 11⁴⁰ under all
sail Latter part the same employed at
mending on old fore royal had the sick
11⁴⁶ butstuck on deck to air himself and bed

Monday
22 commenced with fine breeze from S & course
Latter 11⁴⁰ by 11⁴⁰ under all sail employed at
27⁴⁰ mending old sails the weather is
very warm and pleasant the thermometer
6⁰² stands at 71 in the cabin Middle part
Light winds at 12 o'clock at all the
Captains came on deck and passed most
of the whole watchboard and all Latter
11⁴⁷ part light winds saw gumpies

Monday and a large Albicore
23 commenced with strong winds from south
Latter steering 11⁴⁰ by 11⁴⁰ under all sail
24 The sky is thick and cloudy and has the
appearance of rain middle part the same
34⁴⁷ Latter part employed at washing ship
11⁴⁸ out side

Tuesday
24 commenced with light winds from the southward
Latter steering 11⁴⁰ by 11⁴⁰ under all sail employed
27⁵⁰ at breaking out the fore hatch for water
Long and hunting for the place where the ship
8³⁵ Leaks could not find it Middle part strong breeze
with squalls of rain Latter part the same
employed at mending. Paints to paint the
ship out side and other ships duty. Luffed
to the wind for some time of a fish but
11⁴⁹ did not make out what he was as we did
not see him after we were to the wind

Wednesday
25 commenced with strong breeze from S &
Latter steering 11⁴⁰ by 11⁴⁰ under all sail
26¹⁵ employed at common ships duty
Middle part squally Latter part the same employed
Long at mending the foresail saw blackfish and
90 Porpoises
