Thursday Feb 3

Moderate breezes by the wind middle and better  
part the same saw 9 Whales going quick to  
windward did not have lat 30° 9' S

Friday Feb 4

Moderate trades steering N middle and better  
part the same lat 30° 10' long 84, 15 W

Saturday Feb 5

Moderate trade winds steering N by W  
middle and better part the same lat 30° 10' long 84, 59 W

Sunday Feb 6

Moderate trades steering N by E wind to 2 o'clock 24, 50 W

Monday Feb 7

Moderate trades steering N so ends lat 30° 9' long 84, 02 W
