Came in with moderate breezes from the N.E. and cloudy weather - Ship by the wind in the morn to the N.W. at 6 kept of W. with all prudent sail out. Watch employed in boiling at 12 kept ship to W. by N. all day winds buffling - nothing in sight but one sail

Friday May 27th

Came in with moderate breezes from the S.W. and overcast looking very much like rain - Ship by the wind to the S and E. under easy sail all day. all hands employed in stowing down in the main hold - nothing in sight all day. about 4 P.M. commenced raining very heavy. - Stowed down 110 Bbls. - all night ship under easy sail there being a heavy cross sea on

Saturday May 28th

Came in with strong gales from the S.W. and squally weather and rainy - Ship by the wind on various tack cruising with all prudent sail out - saw two sail steering to the E. nothing more in sight all day

Sunday May 29th

Came in with strong gales from the S.W. and cloudy weather - Ship by the wind to the S and E under double reefed topsails - Nothing in sight all day. Three men sick off duty. One Almy sick with the venereal disease. One with a cut foot and one with a lame arm. - The watch enjoying the sabbath.

Monday May 30th

Came in with light air from the S.W. and fine weather - Ship by the wind to the N.W. with all prudent sail out, cruising - in the P.M. steering N per compass until 4 then luffed to the wind N.W. all night light air and buffling

Tuesday May 31st

Came in with light air from the N.W. and fine pleasant weather - Ship steering S.E. per compass with all sail out. - Nothing in sight all the a.m. - At the P.M. saw porpoises Blackfish and Killers also one sail steering to the W. Good weather and good seeing
