

Ship. Com. Morris of New Bedford

Tuesday June 21st

Comes in with fresh breezes from N.W. and cloudy weather - Ship steering S.E. all the a.m. water blue with spots of green - Saw Crampuses, Cowfish & porpoises and scattering sun-galls, also saw one snake. In the P.M. steering E. & S.E. water green mostly with spots of blue - Saw sun-galls quite plenty up to 6 P.M. - at sunset no sun-galls - water light green - Saw one sail working to the W. - Took in sail for the night at sundown. Lat at merid 49° 00' Long by Chron 23° 10'

Wednesday June 22nd

Comes in with moderate breezes from the N.E. and cloudy weather - Ship steering S.W. with all sail out cruising nothing in sight all the a.m. water green - no sun-galls - toadstools birds or porpoises - in the P.M. a few toadstools & schools of porpoises - water rather changeable. Ship steering S.W. and at night N.W. Lat 48° 56' Long 22° 47'

Thursday June 23rd

Comes in with moderate breezes from N.E. and cloudy weather - Ship steering various courses - Cruising with all sail out - One sail in sight working to the E. - water all day changeable no sun-galls toadstools Vallow Drops or any indications of whales seen through the day. Two men - Cooper & Pope sick with the mumps. Lat at merid 47° 54' Long by Chron 23° 40'

Saturday June 24th

Comes in with strong breezes from the E. and cloudy weather - Ship steering S.W. by S all day for the Silas Richards' Ground - 2 sail in sight one steering to the S.W. and the other to the N.E. at 3 P.M. exchanged long with an English brig. bound to her. Long being 26 differing from ours 2.30 at 4. Saw two schools of Blackfish going quick to the E. - Saw several schools of porpoises and a number of birds saw some sun-galls and jellies - at night took in sail. Lat at merid 48° 54' Lat 48° 30' Long by Chron 24° 30' Long by Brig 26° 00'

Sunday June 25th

Comes in with moderate breezes from the E. and rather hazy - but quite good whaling weather - Ship by the wind to the S.E. with all prudent sail set - in the morning plenty of porpoises and birds but got out of them by 8 - at 10 wore ship standing to the N. and E. - at 12 kept ship S.W. steering so all the P.M. at 4 fell in with birds and porpoises - caught two in the P.M. and one in the morn. - water good all day changing from green to blue and from blue to green alternately - at sunset took in sail for the night heading to the N.E. Long by Chron 24° 37' Lat by merid 44° 56'
